As we approach the end of the Autumn term, I am delighted to report that we finish for the Christmas break with the school in a very strong position. This term has been a tough one for us all. We started off by stating that the coronavirus would not define us. We vowed to deliver a provision to our students which is second to none and wherever possible we would make the school operate as normal as possible. I am proud of all the staff and students who have made this happen. Whether in the classroom, or having to work from home, learning has been of the highest order for each of our seven year groups and we are exactly where we planned to be, in terms of progression through syllabi or schemes of work. Whatever the final method of assessment for our GCSE and A Level students next summer, we will be well positioned when competing on a national stage.

You will appreciate from previous Heckler reports and social media feeds that despite the difficult circumstances, we have had an outstanding term. I continue to marvel at how as a school community we have a wonderful balance of academic excellence, supported by exemplary pastoral care and, where possible this term, the extra-curricular activities that students and indeed staff will long remember, which help cement our school values. Despite many families facing financial challenges, our charity fundraising this term has been excellent, with over £4500 raised to date.

I am sure, like us, you will be delighted that we have been ranked as the 7th best state secondary school in the North of England in the Sunday Times Parent Power Survey, which analyses a plethora of measures over the last 10 years. This accolade is just reward for the tremendous hard work our students, staff and parents put in every day of the week. Indeed, to illustrate the success this year, on our school website you will see a link to our virtual <u>Senior Prizegiving Ceremony</u>, celebrating the academic success of our GCSE and A level students in the 2020 examinations.

Despite the well known difficulties faced by the students, they achieved record results which have put them in very strong positions for progression into the sixth form, to university or high calibre employment.

In spite of difficult public sector funding conditions, we continue to be in a healthy financial position, which will again allow us to further invest in an outstanding provision, in terms of both capital infrastructure and also the human resources directly in front of our students. Indeed, we are currently in the final phase of updating fire safety systems, replacing windows and doors and extending design and technology and food workshops, as the result of a £580,000 bid we achieved from the DfE. We are currently bidding for funding to replace the 'temporary' modern foreign languages block, with a state of the art facility. Hopefully, I will be able to communicate some good news on this later in the year.

I am sad to report that some of our staff are moving on to new career opportunities; Mrs Whitaker, Head of Year will be leaving us and will be replaced by Mrs Griffin. Mrs Edwards is

leaving, who was undertaking a maternity cover for Mrs Fitzgerald, who has now returned. Mrs Noble is going on maternity leave and will be replaced by Mrs Frere, and Mrs Ashaq, a lunchtime supervisor, will be exploring new opportunities. We wish them the best of good fortune in their new endeavours.

As with many departments in school at the moment, it is been a slightly different term since September. However, we have been lucky enough to still provide our students with an excel-

lent Music curriculum and work in specialist classrooms. The curriculum has had to be altered slightly, but students have still been performing, composing and learning about a variety of different styles of music.

Year 7 students have started the year looking at the Elements of Music through a case study on Vivaldi's Four Seasons and doing lots of keyboard work including learning the piece Falling Slowly. Year 8 students have looked at Film Music this term through
