#### Sixth Form Taster Day.



She competed in the Under 17 girls shot putt, winning first place with a personal indoor PB and beating her club's agegroup record by just under a meter. This comes after Anna topped the girls athletics league table at her club, Rothwell Harriers, after a successful summer outdoor season, culminating in a silver medal in the Under 15 girls discus at the Yorkshire County championships held at York University.











Imogen Hawkins-Swaffer, year 9, was awarded Swimmer of the Year byr her Club Halifax as well as winning cups for 14 & under 100 free, 100 breaststroke, and 100 butterfly at the clubs annual award ceremony at the weekend. She was given her award by Olympic Bronze medallist Megan Shackleton an ex swimmer of the club

Here's what her club had to say about her...

The start of this incredible swimming journey began at Swim Babes at just 6 weeks old, then onto swimming lessons at Brighouse Pool and finally moving to Halifax Swimming Club in 2016 at just 8 years old. The first competition was a K&D Teams gala in 2017, followed by a first individual swim in January 2018 in the Grassroots Gala.

The first major achievement was being selected to compete in the Independent Schools Association (ISA) North of England Freestyle Relay Team National finals at the iconic London Olympic Park Aquatics Centre aged just 9. The team won a silver medal at this competition. The following year and still only 10 years of age was once again selected to swim repeating the same success with yet another silver medal.






