



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
Key Stage 3 Art Club

Alumni Projects

At HGS we have a strong alumni community, with a large number of former students keen to contribute to the continued success of the school. A key focus of our National Careers Week activities for 2021 was to celebrate the progression routes of our alumni to inspire and broaden the aspirations of our current students. We contacted our alumni through the scholars association and social media, inviting them to share their career stories, to feature on a poster. We launched a house competition with a brief to design the layout of the alumni poster. The winning designer was a Y10 student who created a very effective layout with an eye-catching design.

70 former students featured on the posters which we shared throughout National Careers Week on social media, through the school newsletter and displayed around the school ready for the students' return to school in March.



We were keen to build upon the success of the poster campaign and arranged for recent alumni to contribute to Y12 and Y13 Future Career Academy sessions. As part of National Apprenticeship Week, alumni now working at Nestle, PWC and Mazars highlighted the range of work-based options available and the application process. The evaluation of the session demonstrated how valuable the students found the opportunity to learn from the experiences of students who were recently in their shoes.

A session was also delivered to the Y13 students applying for jobs and apprenticeships to support them with the application process. Former students who had successfully gained apprenticeships, to include degreeled schemes, provided advice on how to prepare for selection events and reflected upon their personal experiences of the recruitment process. A survey highlighted that 100% of the attendees felt more confident about their applications as a direct result of attending the session.

The Alumni Mentoring Scheme has been launched as a pilot scheme for the 2020-21 academic year to support 7 Year 12 students. All 7 of our alumni mentors left the school in 2020 and are now studying in higher education or undertaking an apprenticeship. In a recent review of the process, feedback indicates that it has not only been a positive experience for the mentees but also the mentors:

My mentor has helped me decide what kind of summer schools to partake in. My mentor has given me an insight to biological sciences. I was struggling whether or not to do Medicine, my mentor mentioned their similar experiences and how she overcame them. Overall just a really positive experience and I recommend to Next year of students. I've had a few discussions with my mentee about useful preparation she could be doing to explore potential uni courses, including books/reading lists she could be looking at. It's been interesting chatting to my mentee about interesting elements of her A-Levels and further reading that she's done. The mentoring process has helped remind me which parts of my own degree I'd like to explore more!






