The HGS Music department is an extremely busy, popular and successful department and we aim to provide every student the opportunity to express themselves through the pleasures of music-making. Whether it's making music in class, taking up instrumental lessons from our highly experienced peripatetic staff or joining the extensive range of extra-curricular music opportunities available to all, music is heard throughout HGS.

Music lessons are of a very practical nature with topics including Pop Bands, Film Scoring, Ukuleles, Musicals, Samba Band, African Drumming, Blues and Music Technology. This is backed up by theoretical work in notation, musical elements, the orchestra, a broad range of stylistic listening topics and lots of singing. In addition to our curriculum qualifications, we provide access to all students in the performance exams of the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music or RSL Rock School. In the last 12 months alone over 50 students have passed exams ranging from grade 1 to grade 8 and including many merits and distinctions.

Extra-curricular music is a real strength of the school and music can always be heard throughout the school day; whether it is in morning assemblies, curriculum lessons, band and choir rehearsals or just students practising on a lunchtime. We have a 35-piece Concert Band, a Soul Band, both Senior & Junior choirs, String, Percussion and Guitar ensembles, as well as a variety of other smaller groups. We regularly give concerts in school or at school functions, as well as in the wider community. Our annual house music competition provides the opportunity for all students to take part and provides two days of amazing (and fun!) performances in the summer term. Our new Tuned-In music club enables students to develop their music creativity further, whether it is performing in groups, composing or create an mp3 in the recording studio ready for YouTube.
