Department Focus: PE



The Physical Education department involves every pupil in the school. We aim to provide all students with the opportunity to experience a range of different sports both as part of the curriculum and extra-curricular activities. This covers a broad range of activities in lessons including aerobics, athletics, badminton, basketball, circuit training, cross country, cricket, football, gymnastics, handball, hockey, multi skills, netball, rounders, rugby and tennis. The House system is a traditional and popular feature of the sporting programme with pupils from the four Houses competing in sporting competitions to eventually win the Lees Cup.

The school has some outstanding sports performers and we compete in a range of District, County and National competitions in athletics, badminton, cross country, football, hockey, netball, rugby, rounders and tennis. The department also runs trips, including a water sports trip to the Lake District for Year 9 pupils, a junior ski trip to Austria and a senior ski trip to America.

We have recently linked with the RFU and are part of the All Schools Rugby Programme. This will provide opportunities for pupils to experience competitive matches as well as undertaking coaching and officiating courses. High-level coaches are also working with pupils in lessons and running additional sessions at lunchtimes and after school. A group of Year 11 students were invited to attend a kit design event hosted at Doncaster Knights stadium by Canterbury sportswear. They have designed a new school rugby kit which will be presented to the school in March.

Badminton is a very popular sport with large numbers of pupils attending early morning sessions before school. We have some very talented players who will be representing the school in County and Regional competitions after winning the district and Kirklees events last year.
