National Careers Week

This week we have run a wide range of careers related sessions in school to celebrate National Careers Week and National Apprenticeship Week 2019. Activities have aimed to raise students' awareness of the opportunities available to them beyond school and to develop and widen students' aspirations. Students have had the opportunity to speak to young people currently undertaking apprenticeships, they have been able to speak to representatives from a range of universities and all students in Years 7 to 9 have had the opportunity to talk to a variety of employers from different sectors and develop their employability skills.

We offered a range of apprenticeship related activities in school with all students being able to talk to an Apprenticeship Ambassador on Monday and two young people undertaking apprenticeships formed part of an employer panel on Wednesday. Linda Beever from the National Apprenticeship Service talked to all Year 10 students about current developments in apprenticeships including the increasing range of opportunities within Higher and Degree Apprenticeships. Employer led events included EY Foundation delivering an interactive Dragons Den style employer led activity to all Year 8 students and Ahead Partnership facilitating an employer Q+A panel for all of Year 7 and Year 9 students. Employers included representatives from Creative industries, the Digital Sector, the Financial Sector, Engineering and Construction amongst others.

Universities included two representatives from Newcastle University who delivered two lunchtime workshops about STEM, Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences careers. York University delivered an Introduction to Higher Education to the whole of Year 10 and Leeds University Medical students delivered two lunchtime workshops to Year 11 and Year 10 students about the realities of studying medicine. Sheffield University and Huddersfield University also formed part of a mini careers fair alongside QAA apprenticeships on Monday lunchtime.

Students engaged really well in all activities and the careers week has been very successful, with comments from employers praising our students' 'insightful questions' and students being described as 'brilliantly switched on' and 'great'!
