Dear Parents/Carers

As we approach the start of a new academic year, we can share our plans for the first week back to school with some degree of certainty. As I am sure you are aware, the Government has asked schools to undertake coronavirus testing for all students as they return after the summer holidays. We have tried to minimise the disruption to the start of the year, but, as I am sure you can appreciate, this is a logistical challenge for a school of our size. Below is the key information for each year group covering the arrangements for the first week.

Please pay particular attention to the start and finish times for each year group and note that the school is closed to all students on Monday 6 September and Monday 13 September.

# Monday 6 September – Inset Day

School is closed to all students.

# Tuesday 7 September – Induction Day

School is open to Y7, Y12 and Y13 only

Year 7	08:30 - 08:40 arrival at North Street Student Entrance 15:15 students will be dismissed via the North Street Student Entrance
Year 12	08.30 onwards staggered arrival via Main Reception. Individual arrival times will be sent to students in the final week of the holidays
Year 13	13.15 arrive via the High Street gate into the Middle Yard to be met by tutors.

# Wednesday 8 September

The school day will be split between morning and afternoon sessions to facilitate coronavirus testing. Students in year 7 and 12 only will be in school all day.

### **Thursday 9 September**

#### Normal school day for all years

Students in Y7 – 11 to enter the school via the North Street Student Entrance. All students must be in school by 08:40 when the first bell sounds and make their way to form period. Students not in school at this time will need to report to Main Reception to be marked as late.

Year 12 – 13 will be directed by the sixth form team

### Friday 10 September

Normal school day for all years

#### Please note that school will close at 14.15 to allow preparation for the Entrance Exam

#### Monday 13 September

Entrance Exam - school is closed to all students

#### **Face Coverings**

We have taken the decision to remove the compulsory use of face coverings from September. In line with current guidance, it will be the personal choice of staff and students if they want to continue to wear face coverings in crowded areas. Please be aware this decision is subject to change in the future and will be kept under review.

#### **Entering school from Thursday 9 September**

This year we will be asking all students in Y7 – 11 to enter the school via the North Street Student Entrance each morning. All students must be in school by 08.40 when the external gates will be locked. After this time students are classed as late and will have to report to Main Reception. We believe that punctuality is important, so please ensure students arrive in good time, allowing for the roads being busier at both arrival and dismissal times.

#### Uniform

During the last academic year we were sympathetic to the difficulties students and parents faced with regard to school uniform. However, as society has started to open up fully, I would like to remind you of our expectations regarding school uniform. We expect students to be in correct

uniform at all times and our expectations are clearly outlined on the school website. If you are unsure about any element of the uniform policy, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

### Information regarding Testing for Covid-19

On their return to school, students will be asked to take two lateral flow Covid tests. This is in line with Government policy for the start of term.

The tests that students will be taking will are the newer Orient Gene test which only require nasal swabs. Testing will be undertaken by trained test operatives and full instructions will be given to all students, as these tests may be different to the ones we have all become accustomed to.

The first test will take place on the first day students return to school, with the second test a few days later.

It is important for the safety and security of all students and staff as well as keeping schools and communities safer that as many students as possible undertake these Covid tests at school.

I would therefore urge you to agree to your child taking these in-school tests.

Following the second in-school test, students will be issued with a box of home test kits for twiceweekly testing. Further details about these tests, how to report the results and how long at-home testing will last, will be available shortly after the start of term.
