DEBATERS DO IT AGAIN!

For the third year in a row, a team from Heckmondwike Grammar School has reached the regional final of The Mace national debating competition. This is, in effect, the semi-final of the national competition, with just twelve teams proceeding to the final.

This year's competition has looked rather dif-

ferent, with fewer schools entering as a result of the pandemic, meaning that the team has only had to come through one round of debates, rather than two, to reach this stage. Until early this afternoon, it looked as if the team were going to reach the regional final without participating in a single debate! A late withdrawal meant the school was left without a team to debate against, meaning they would have received an automatic bye. Fortunately, another school was able to provide a late substitute team, meaning our speakers actually had someone to debate against.

The other major difference is that this year's debates are conducted over Zoom, rather than in person. Despite the occasional technical glitch, all the debates ran smoothly.

The school was represented by seasoned debating veterans Maisy Nichols and Leo Beevers, who were proposing the motion:

'This House Would ban job applicants from disclosing the names of educational institutions that they have attended'

Maisy and Leo performed impressively, combining carefully researched points and statistical evidence with their customary eloquence, expressing themselves fluently and persuasively.



Hopes are high that they can go one step further this year, and reach the national final.

We were competing against 1807 other individuals and teams, many made up of veteran cryptographers, in an annual competition that is now in its 20th year! We entered more teams than last year, including two very strong year 7 teams led by Miraya Vyas (Pi-Thons) and Cobra Pi (Mischa Mistry).

Red Orange Vellow Green Blue Indigo Violet

You will need:

4mm needles
Double Knit yarn in one of the rainbow colours

1. Cast on 33sts

 Cast of 3355
 Knit every row until the knitting measures 15cm (6")
 Cast off You can use different shades of the same colour to create patterns and textures or try different stitch techniques to add variety. 

BBC Launch Lessons

Reacting quickly to the news of UK schools moving to remote learning, the new offer from the BBC will ensure all children can access curriculum-based learning, even if they don't have access to the internet.



For parent with younger children starting on Monday 11 January, each week day on CBBC will see a three-hour block of primary school programming from 9am, including BBC Live Lessons and BBC Bite-size Daily, as well as other educational programming such as Our School and Celebrity Supply Teacher and much loved titles such as Horrible Histories, Art Ninja and Operation Ouch.

For parents with older student BBC Two will cater for secondary students with programming to support the GCSE curriculum, with a least two hours of content each weekday.

- For secondary pupils, Bitesize is also home to two-week learning packs for English and Maths in KS3 (years 7, 8 and 9) as well as This Term's Topics for other subjects to be used at home or to support teachers in the remote classrooms.
- For students in Years 10 and 11, the Bitesize GCSE offer allows students to pick their exam board and subject to find everything they need to help with their studies. Visit bbc.co.uk/bitesize/sec-ondary for details.
