


Lectiones Latinae (Latin Lessons)

Latin lessons for years 7 and 8 started in September, taught on a lunchtime once a week by Mr Bensley. Before lockdown the learners had 1 lesson per cycle taught on alternate weeks in order to keep the two year groups separate. Lessons have been continuing during lockdown via Teams but because both year groups can be taught at the same time they are currently having weekly lessons.

A total of 20 learners have been attending regularly; Ananya Chinchalkar, Teygh Gill, Sefeoluwa Idowu, Sarah Jayan, Mary Kernick, Joe Martin, Joseph Mason, Yusuf Mehmood, Anoli Nupe Hewage, Mikayla Pasquel, Shreya Patel (whose brother Rohan Patel has been taught by Mr Bensley and will be taking GCSE Latin this year), Zain-ul-Abidin Patel, Methuli Perera Kuranage, Simran Shakoor, Hiba Syed, Maria-Eliza Xenikaki, Alina Iqbal, Annamarie Kaushiva, Oliver Kearney, and Maya Slusarczyk.

The course will take 3 years with the learners taking exams in Summer 2023. The course is being taught using 'Latin to GCSE' by Henry Cullen and John Taylor. This set of 2 books covers all the GCSE language content in 10 chapters. The learners have already finished Chapter 1 and are now working on Chapter 2, having learned first conjugation verbs in the present tense and first and second declension nouns in the five main cases together with a few conjunctions, adverbs, and prepositions. They are already able to translate a wide range of sentences.

Red | Orange | Yellow | Green | Blue | Indigo | Violet

- 4mm needles
 Double Knit yarn in one of the rainbow colours
- 1. Cast on 33sts

 Knit every row until the knitting measures 15cm (6")
 Cast off You can use different shades of the same colour to create patterns and textures or try different stitch techniques to add variety.

The picture on the right is an entry to our Astronomy Photography Competition by Jasmine Jacob in 7H1, using an iPhone and a telescope



BBC Launch Lessons

Reacting quickly to the news of UK schools moving to remote learning, the new offer from the BBC will ensure all children can access curriculum-based learning, even if they don't have access to the internet.



For parent with younger children starting on Monday 11 January, each week day on CBBC will see a three-hour block of primary school programming from 9am, including BBC Live Lessons and BBC Bite-size Daily, as well as other educational programming such as Our School and Celebrity Supply Teacher and much loved titles such as Horrible Histories, Art Ninja and Operation Ouch.

For parents with older student BBC Two will cater for secondary students with programming to support the GCSE curriculum, with a least two hours of content each weekday.

- For secondary pupils, Bitesize is also home to two-week learning packs for English and Maths in KS3 (years 7, 8 and 9) as well as This Term's Topics for other subjects to be used at home or to support teachers in the remote classrooms.
- For students in Years 10 and 11, the Bitesize GCSE offer allows students to pick their exam board and subject to find everything they need to help with their studies. Visit bbc.co.uk/bitesize/sec-ondary for details.

Accessing Team using Xbox/Playstation

How to access online learning on an Xbox

- 1. Plug a keyboard in to the Xbox USB slot (less than £10 from Amazon)
- 2. Go in to my games and apps
- 3. Find Microsoft Edge and select
- 4. Type in Office 365 and log in as you would in school.
- 5. You can then access your work and use key packages including: Word, Excel, Powerpoint, Teams, your emails
- 6. To move around you use the Xbox controller or plug in a mouse (available widely including Amazon)

How to access online learning on a Playstation

- 1. Identify the Playstation internet browser icon (it is www with dots around it)
- 2. Press the Playstation logo on the controller
- 3. Go to the library and find options for games and applications
- 4. Go into applications and you will find the internet browser
- 5. Type in Office 365 and log in as you would in school
- 6. You can then access your work and use key packages including: Word, Excel,
