

Roll of Thunder, Hear My Cry by Mildred D. Taylor is an excellent book. It tells the story of the Logan family as they try to keep their land in a mainly-white, rural town in Mississippi, America. 9 year old Cassie Logan struggles with the way things are and thinks about the way things should be for black people in her community.

This book was originally recommended to me by my mum. She read it in high school and loved it. She said that I should read it too because it is a really good book with an important message about equality, courage and a positive ending.

I've read and really like this book too because it is based on a real life situation that many families went through. This book really highlights the difficulties and traumas faced by black African Americans in 1930's America. The most interesting fact is that the narrator is a child, and the reader is shown what it means to



have to face the horrors of prejudice and racism through her eyes. It makes it very real and relatable on her behalf.


Library Services and Support during Covid 19
