Year 12 Aspiring Scientists Success

We are very proud of Amena Shaikh and Umm Kulthoom Kara in Year 12, who have been selected to take part in the Aspiring Scientists Training Programme, run by the Gurdon Institute at the University of Cambridge. The scheme is highly competitive, and the Institute's aim is to give exceptional and aspirational young people the opportunity to experience and work in an academic research environment.

The Gurdon Institute is a developmental research lab with a particular focus on understanding cancer processes. A wide variety of research is undertaken at the Institute including projects on brain development, liver regeneration, DNA repair and cancer treatments, using a variety of cutting-edge methods with model organisms that our students will be able to experience first-hand.

The scheme runs for one week at the end of the summer term. Our students will spend 3 hours each day working in the lab, learning and practising modern research techniques beyond the A Level Biology specification. They will also attend interactive workshops and conduct their own research to present to their colleagues on the programme. Finally, they will have the incredibly valuable experience of

networking with current PhD students and working scientists, to find out more about academic careers and possible future opportunities.

It is testament to the exceptional calibre of our sixth form students that



two of them have been selected for this exciting opportunity – both from the same class! Current Year 11 students take note; this opportunity, and many similar ones, will be open to you very soon.

We are delighted and wish them all the best for this amazing opportunity, and look forward to hearing about their experiences when the new school year starts in September.



Subject Focus: Psychology

As I write this the Year13 students have just completed their end of Year Assessment and the teachers are about to embark on the great task of marking them. It is the culmination of 2 years of hard work and we would like to congratulate them on their fantastic efforts during these unusual times. I am sure that all of their efforts will have been worthwhile. Meanwhile, the Year 12 students are gearing up for their mock examination, so the whole process of marking and sitting examinations will begin again. The Year 12's have recently covered the topic of phobias in which they learnt about a range of phobias that people suffer from; including a phobia for the number 13! They have also gained greatly




from the experience of doing some practical psychology in the form of experiments relating to the topic of forgetting, in which the students had to try and recall information both inside and outside of the classroom to see if there was any difference produced from being in different settings. They will have gained greatly from this experience which will both bring elements of methods and deepen their understanding. Students were also given some preparation for University by being offered both a lecture style and a seminar style of learning. They certainly noticed a difference from their usual lessons!

The department welcomes back Mrs Brooksby from her maternity leave. Typically, she has thrown her-


self into things with enthusiasm and is working closely with the year 12 group in intervention classes.
