LCDs are defined as a display of information on a screen, which uses liquid crystals that become visible when electricity is passed through them. LCD is an abbriviation for liquid crystal display.





Diagram Explanation:
This is VAN operation using a grating opposite a homeotropic surface and TN operation when opposite a planar homongenous surface. TN geometry offers huge benefits such as a higher cell gap, achromatic performance and wideviewing angles for the HAN state.






