On Friday 11 June, a design team consisting of Alice Cheesbrough, Naomi Fisayo, Hannah Rouse and Emily Sharp (with Mr Stevens and Mrs Power tagging along) attented a Celebration Event at the Design Museum in London after being shortlisted for the Design Ventura Award.

After being given time to explore the inspirational exhibitions, we made our way to the Huth Gallery for the formal awards ceremony. The seven shortlisted teams were all presented with an award and certificate, ending with the Sow Beautiful team from Heckmondwike Grammar School being announced as overall winners! Once they had stopped shaking from the excitement of their well-deserved success, Alice, Naomi, Hannah and Emily were smiling from ear to ear and almost bursting with pride. It was a wonderful and emotional event to be a part of.





Since winning the competition, Alice, Naomi, Hannah and Emily have been pushed out of their comfort zones several times, taking part in a live interview on BBC Radio Leeds and a recorded interview which will form part of a segment to be show on Leeds TV (Freeview 7 / Sky 117 / VM 159) on Wednesday 23 June from 6pm. It has to be said, that they have all taken to their new media duties like proverbial ducks to water.

The journey doesn't end here. The team will now work with a professional product design company to develop the seed launcher to ensure it is suitable for commercial manufacture. The product will then

be professionally produced before being sold in the Design Museum shop (we've already

had a pre-order for 50 of them!). All profits will be donated to



Kirkwood Hospice- chosen by the team members themselves because of their close connections with the charity.

and we hope that this triumph is the first of many achievements for them in the world of de-

sign.

You may remember back in November 2020 our Deputy Headteacher, Mr Tipler, ran to school from his home for Children in Need, covering a distance of 15miles. It was part of his Run Streak Challenge, and we caught up with Mr Tipler for an update on his progress:

As part of my New Year's Resolutions in 2019 I challenged myself to complete a 100-day Run Streak. This is where you have to run for at least a mile on 100 consecutive days. I am the type of person that needs challenges and targets to reach. I reached 100 with no problem at all.... but I kept going. So here I am on

18th June 2021 with 900 days under my belt. My wife has been with me on most of these runs, but sadly she had to bow out on day 725 when she fell off her bike and broke her leg. Those of you with a calendar to hand will quickly work out that this was Christmas Day last year (so much of this was spent in A&E). If I have my calculations correct the big 1000 should occur on Sunday 26th September. So, I am planning an

event to celebrate this achievement and would like to invite all staff, students and parents to join me on my 1000th run. More in-depth details will follow in the new academic year, but if you and your family would like to run with me then you would be most welcome. My planned route is a figure-of-8 loop, so there are range of distances you can choose to run: 2.8km, 5.2km and the full course of 8km so all abilities would be welcome. I am also going to raise money for Cancer Research UK in memory of my dear brother-in-law, Matthew, who sadly succumbed to this dreadful disease shortly after graduating from the University of Durham in 2003. All of my big runs (including my Children in Need run) are dedicated to his memory and this will be no different. So many of us are impacted by cancer it is such a worthy cause, and I do hope you will come along and run in the memory of someone dear to you. Further details will be released nearer the time, but please put the date in your diary: 26th September 2021. (After this, I think I will have a rest...my knees are beginning to make a funny noise whenever I walk down the stairs!) I hope to see you there!




