Department Focus: Geography



This week is 'World Environment Week', as Illustrated by Mr. Tuck's excellent assembly on air pollution. The Geography department tries to illustrate some of the many issues which impact upon our environment as well as the social and economic world. We have been tackling the issue of climate change with Year 9 as part of the GCSE curriculum. Looking at both the causes, impacts and important global ways in which we are hoping to tackle the problem.

Greta Thunberg has sharpened the focus of young people across the world with her moving protest and

statement to the UN Conference of the parties. David Attenborough has also spoken out over the issue of plastics and there is a drive to raise awareness across the country regarding the use and disposal of single use plastics.

The environment is becoming a higher priority amongst global leaders and Geography is a subject that tries to look at the issues from many perspectives, dealing with the science to understand the problems, but also the economic and social factors that play a part in creating valuable solutions from flooding in the Somerset levels, the extremes of climate in the UK becoming more common as a result of climate change, to the loss of biodiversity, oil pollution and nuclear accidents. All are complex and diverse issues, that we as Geographers from Year 7 to Year 13 try to sort out.

The photograph graphically illustrates the impact of climate change on the Solheimajokull glacier. The size denotes how far the glacier stretched in 2010 and the resulting amounts of ice loss over the last 9 years. The glacier will cease to exist in a generation's time.

The pair increased the run rate in the final five overs with Noah unbeaten on 68 and Tom 93 posting an impressive total of 181 from 20 overs.
