And it's raining so pitifully you'll never find them. Here, an hour's drive to Mexico, there's no such event as spring. All night clouds have gathered and what there is of April rain needles the granulated riverbeds.

And who'd go back to Minnesota? Is there any field where those horses all the summer could graze, almost human the way its grasses breathe?

I think if you were here you'd tell me.

But I remember drinking all afternoon with Peter in St. Paul on the 4th of July the summer we wrote *dark* in notebooks, wrote *beautiful*, in poems that wanted to sound like you, and we drove down the highway barely able to steer to Rochester, Minnesota, to find the ponies who blessed you. Congratulations to year 13 student, Leo Beevers, who recently won a prestigious national essay-writing competition, Trinity College, Cambridge's Gould Prize in English Literature. In doing so, he scooped a £600 reward for himself and the school!

Leo, who is currently preparing an application to read English at the University of Cambridge, explained the subject of his essay as follows: "James Wright is one of my absolute favourite poets. The essay was an analysis of David Wojahn's "Elegy for James Wright" which ran in tandem with Wright's poem "A Blessing", as well as Wright's life, works, letters, and other written material. In my essay, I wrote about how it reflected poets' constant struggles to find their own voices and Wojahn's


commitment to, in his own words, fuse the "personal and the public memory" by breathing new life into dead images."

The assessors were full of praise for Leo's essay on the poet, James Wright, writing that:

such an accomplished piece of writing. We felt that your analysis of David Wojahn's 'Elegy for James Wright' and the relationship between the two poets was outstanding. It is a major achievement to write an essay that is so consistently confident, attentive and interesting. 

### **House Debates**



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

Q: When were these murals drawn?


A: They were drawn in the summer holidays in fact, quite a while ago.

# Table Top Gaming




