## National Careers Week 2020



We welcomed 18 external visitors into school this week who worked with us to celebrate National Careers Week 2020.

Employers came from a wide range of organisations such as Chadwick Lawrence Solicitors, Creative Scene arts organisation, thebigword professional translation and interpreting service, St. James' Wealth Management and FINDRS Recruitment.

We also invited in representatives from organisations such as the Leeds City Region Enterprise Partnership (LEP) to ensure students have the most up to date information about growth sectors within our region and the Royal Voluntary Service to help students to learn more about local volunteering opportunities and to help students to build their employability skills for the future.

To focus on everything progression related we had information stands in the Swann Hall focussing on Apprenticeships and Degree Apprenticeships, as well as a wide range of universities which included Cambridge, Huddersfield, Bradford and Newcastle.

Some universities had stands in the Swann Hall for all students to access but a range of opt in workshops were also offered across the week which were well attended by students across a wide range of year groups. It was great to see students opting into workshops such as an Introduction to Oxbridge, Student Life and Budgeting, STEM Careers, Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences Careers and we also welcomed a current 2nd year medical student from Leeds University who delivered 2 workshops around the realities of studying medicine.

Tutorial activities from Years 7-11 all had a career exploration focus and form groups worked together to share their career aspirations for the future. Staff across school got involved with putting posters up on classroom and office doors describing skills they had gained in previous jobs to widen the discussion around career development across the school.

We asked students to tell us about the impact the activities have had on them – feedback from the lunchtime workshops was extremely positive with students writing down what they had learned from the sessions which included learning about 'different career paths' and 'transferable skills.'

Comments from Year 7 students who all attended the Careers Panel facilitated by Ahead Partnership included that they liked 'the range of jobs spoken about' 'all the tips they gave' and said that the session was 'very lively and engaging.'

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Our external visitors all made

positive comments about the school. They were impressed by the warm welcome they received in school and by our 'smiling, enthusiastic', 'polite' and 'engaged' students and our team was extremely impressed with students' attitudes to activities across all year groups. It was fantastic seeing students from different year groups working together in the lunchtime workshops. One visitor commented 'whatever you need next time, I'll be back', which seemed to sum up the positive impression all the students had made on our visitors.

Cambridge Chemistry Challenge Lower 6th


#### Cambridge Chemistry Challenge Lower 6th (C3L6)

A small group of our more able Year12 students are participating the Cambridge Chemistry Challenge Lower 6th(C3L6). C3L6 is a competition designed to extend students' knowledge of chemistry beyond the A level syllabus and is perfect for anyone with a genuine interest in chemistry who wants to thoroughly challenge themselves. These promising chemists are currently preparing for the competition in June and any who perform particu-

larly well will be in with a chance of being invited to a residential at Cambridge University.

The monthly sessions consist of a tutorial to explain the theory behind the university level content with subsequent sessions to go through the solutions, giving time for students to work through the questions independently first.


Finally, the library hosted the annual bookmark competition. It was wonderful to see all the creative bookish designs.
