



Debating Victory

On Monday 1 July eight Heckmondwike students travelled to Huddersfield Grammar School, accompanied by Mrs Dare and Mr Falshaw to take part in a debating competition with six other teams. The format was particularly challenging, as the teams were only told what motions they would be debating fifteen minutes before the competition began, and whether they would be proposing or opposing.

Two groups of four teams competed in a round-robin stage, each debating against three other teams. A team of Year 7 'novices', consisting of Sadie Tidswell, Chidubem Oseme, Zahra Mahdi and Abdullah Bassam found themselves pitted against mainly Year 9 and 10 students from other schools. They performed very creditably, winning one and losing two of the debates, and learning a great deal from the experience.



A more experienced Year 10 team, of Leo Beevers, Maisy Nichols, Iona Gallagher and Mollie O'Connor, breezed through the group stage by winning all three debates convincingly, to find themselves pitted against St. David's School from Manchester in the Grand Final. A very close debate ensued on the prison service, with an impressively high level of argument and oratory on each side. Heckmondwike were eventually pronounced winners, to add another trophy to the school's cabinet!

Department Focus: Music

On top of the day to day classroom curriculum teaching, the music department offers all students an opportunity to take part in our huge extra-curricular programme. We have four vocal groups - Junior Choir, Senior Choir, a Senior Girls Choir and a new a cappella group. We have a 35-piece Concert Band as well as a Soul Band that regularly plays gigs outside of school. Our smaller 'chamber' ensembles include a String Group, a Guitar Group and a Percussion Group. We also run a Music Theory club as well as 'Tuned-In' - a music club for rehearsing, composing or recording. Whilst some ensembles naturally favour certain instrumentalists, there is always one for any student of any ability to join. Our groups rehearse most lunchtimes and after school, so the music department is always busy and a musical place to be.

We undertake numerous performances and concerts throughout the year and these take place both in and out of school. This year has included the following performances - Marsden Jazz Festival, Birkenshaw Music Festival, Christmas Showcase Concert, the annual Carol Service, Senior Prize Giving, Jo Cox 6th Form Centre opening, 'Music For Youth' Festival, GCSE Performance Evening, our Spring Disney Showcase Concert, The Great Get Together Big Sing, Transition Day and an afternoon performing at the Avery Care Nursing Home.

Students are always encouraged to develop their solo and small ensemble skills throughout the year. Our House Music competition has been running this week which gives all students of all abilities an opportunity to showcase their talents. Most weeks we have live performances in our various year group assemblies - nerve-racking, but extremely rewarding. We also encourage our musicians to undertake ABRSM or RockSchool music exams and this year we have had a staggering 56 of our students taking these exams!

All that remains this year are performances at Junior Prize Giving in the last week of term and a London Musical Theatre trip next week!
