On Tuesday Key Stage 3 and 4 boys badminton teams competed in the West Yorkshire championships hosted by The Grammar School at Leeds (G.S.A.L). The Key stage 4 boys team of Anthony Zhao, David Peng, Nandakishore Kahumani and Srinath Ravi were drawn in a tough group. They put in a spirited performance losing their first three matches by only a single point. They bounced back to produce an excellent win against Beckfoot before losing to the eventual winners G.S.A.L to finish in 3rd place overall.

The Key Stage 3 boys team of Asish Chittamuru, Suhas Gudla, Akhil Maddula and Sumedh Chittamuru stormed through the group stages beating, Beckfoot, North Huddersfield and Q.E.G.S without losing a game and only conceding a handful of points. This set up a final against G.S.A.L. Asish made a great start winning his single match against the number one ranked player from G.S.A.L. Suhas and Akhil then secured a doubles win, followed up by Sumedh winning the second singles match with some high quality play. The players went on to comfortably win the remaining two double matches and secured the gold medal as West Yorkshire Champions. They will now play in the Yorkshire championships. These will be held at York railway institute on Tuesday 19th March.

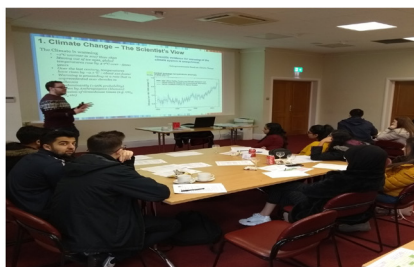
Congratulations to all of the players on their efforts and the sporting way in which they conducted themselves during the tournament.

Students were also delighted to meet Kate Lee, a HGS alumna and first-year veterinary medicine student at Selwyn, who was to share some of her experiences of making the transition from Heckmondwike to Cambridge.

Department Focus: Physics

The physics department returned to school in September in high spirits following a very pleasing and successful set of GCSE and A-level physics results, with 60% of grades at A-level being at A* to B, and 64% of grades at GCSE being grade 9-7. Take-up of the subject at A-level for Year 12 was also strong, with 45 students opting for physics. The department aims to give students an exciting and interesting experience of physics at Key Stage 3, GCSE and A-level. We are very pleased to see so many students do so well in exams and go on to exciting and amazing degree courses and careers with a strong physics content, that you couldn’t do in any other way.

Recent pleasant reminders of past students include an email from Edward Walters—a student who left the school 17 years ago. There are still some of Ed’s teachers at HGS!

Ed writes: “Time has marched on since I last set foot on your classroom. It’s a little surprising to realise that 17 years have passed (we’ve lost a planet and gained some particles since then!)....after many twists and turns I’ve ended up in Southern California running a mechanical testing lab in the materials engineering department of SpaceX. Not via the path I expected to take, but it’s a fascinating place to work. It’s certainly fun to walk past rockets every day, and we have a spectacular gate guardian!” Last year Tim Gregory, ex-HGS A-level physics student, starred in the BBC TV programme ‘Astronauts: Do you have what it takes?’ Many of his former HGS teachers, friends and classmates were very kindly invited to a family gathering for the announcement of the winner. Tim did amazingly well to come second in this exacting selection process. He continues to work for his PhD.

On the topic of space, recently the British astronaut Tim Peake’s Soyuz spacecraft that he used to return from the International Space Station went on a national tour, visiting Bradford’s Science Museum. The physics department took a trip to see it, and at the same time took what we like to think of as the department’s ‘first album cover’ photo with a 3D camera.
