INTRODUCTION

Politics is a rich and rewarding A-level, which equips students with the knowledge and skills to develop an informed, critical understanding of the modern world. The four core elements of the course – government and politics of the UK and the US, comparative politics, and political ideologies and concepts – work together to give students a nuanced, multi-dimensional understanding of contemporary politics and historic developments, facilitating an excellent transition to degree-level study in social and political sciences or related disciplines.
