





all students will follow a tutorial programme aimed at developing the skills needed to be a successful student and develop a deeper understanding of the world around them. This programme has been designed with the students to equip them for life after Sixth Form.

Our timetable operates over a twoweek cycle. Most A-Level subjects are allocated 10 hours per cycle of lesson time. Tutorial sessions are allocated I hour per cycle for all students, with some students spending some additional time

with their tutor when necessary. This means that all students have a number of periods on their timetable when they are not in lessons. Our dedicated sixth form centre, well-resourced library and independent learning area provide an ideal location for students to study, though students are able to leave the site at these times if they choose to.





Student Support

We offer first class support to students within our Sixth Form. At the start of year 12 each student will be allocated a tutor who will be their first point of contact. Tutors will meet with students on a regular basis and carefully monitor their progress. Each year group has a dedicated Head of Year who oversees the progress of all students in the year, and intervenes where necessary.

The happiness and wellbeing of our students is vital to their success in school. Our pastoral support system ensures that no student slips through the net, and all have access to any support they need to flourish. The support offered to students can take many forms, from developing time management and planning skills, work with the Student Welfare Officer and to referrals to other services such as the school nurse or school counsellor.

All students also have access to our excellent in-house careers team who can help students to prepare themselves thoroughly for whatever career they aspire to.

All students in Year 12 will have a one to one guidance interview, and in Year 13 students are given personalised guidance and support as the apply for university, apprenticeship or employment.

The Senior Committee organise fundraising events throughout the school year to support their chosen charities, raising thousands of pounds each year for those less fortunate than themselves.

Sixth Form students at Heckmondwike Grammar have a wide range of opportunities to develop their skills outside the classroom. Our Sixth Form is an integral part of the school community, with students acting as positive role models for students in the main school.

The Sixth Form Senior Committee play a leading role in shaping the school, with representatives contributing all aspects of school life. The Head Students chair the school Senate, which meets throughout the year to discuss issues raised by students. The members of the Senate are elected by their year councils, all of which are led by Senior Committee Members. The Head Students are invited to attend a Senior Leadership Team meeting following each Senate meeting, sharing the feedback from students with Senior Leaders.

Students also have the opportunity to become a School Prefect. This could be either an academic prefect, supporting younger students who are facing challenges in particular subjects, or a behaviour prefect supporting the smooth running of the school day.

Our Sixth Form students have a wide range of opportunities to develop their skills and interests outside the classroom, including through dedicated enrichment time on Wednesday afternoon. We encourage students to set up activities of interest to them giving them the chance to develop their leadership and communication skills as well as enriching the Sixth Form experience for all students. Recent enrichment activities have included sports, volunteering, the Psychology Society, Anthropology and MedSoc, the Medical Society supporting students who are interested in Medicine and Dentistry careers.









Careers & Progression

As part of our excellent support for post-18 progression, we offer:


Your Future in Your Hands
