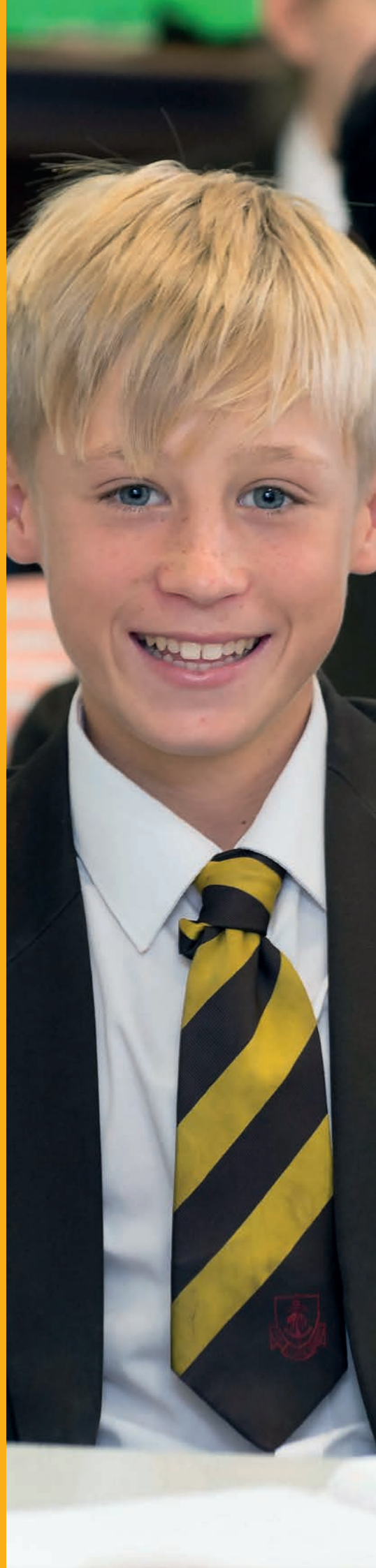

The Curriculum

An exciting and broad-ranging curriculum is crucial in engaging the most enquiring of minds. Our curriculum provides the body of knowledge, skills and attitudes relevant to the high ability students who attend Heckmondwike Grammar School. Our students develop their capacity for applying this knowledge in future life so that they are fully prepared for the challenges in further and higher education, work and leisure.

Key Stage 3 (Years 7 & 8)

Students follow a curriculum of English, Maths, Biology, Physics, Chemistry (taught as Coordinated Science in Year 7), Physical Education, Religious Education, Geography, History, Technology, Spanish or French, Drama, Music, Art and Computer Science.

Key Stage 4 (Years 9 – 11)

Midway through Year 8, students choose their GCSE option subjects to complement the compulsory subjects of English Language and Literature, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry and Physics, Core Religious Education and Core Physical Education. GCSEs are taught in all subjects over 3 years from Year 9 to Year 11.

The subjects on offer to study to GCSE include: Art and Design, Business, Computer Science, Drama, Food Preparation

and Nutrition, French, Geography, Design Technology Graphics, History, Music, Physical Education, Religious Education, Design Technology Resistant Materials and Spanish.

Key Stage 5 (Years 12 – 13)

The vast majority of our students choose to continue with us post-16, accessing a wide breadth of A level options with enrichment

electives. Due to strong results, progression from here to a range of top universities and apprenticeships is the norm, and our students move on to high calibre careers in all sectors.

Outcomes

Our students arrive with us in Year 7 having done very well at their primary schools. Despite this, not only is the expected achievement very high, but progress is also outstanding. Year on year, GCSE results put Heckmondwike Grammar in the top 10-20% of schools nationally. At A level, results are commonly the best of all school-based sixth forms in Kirklees.

Transition & Student Support



"The Heads of Year take pride in helping students with issues they have with their work or any of their own problems. If you are struggling with a subject, the school offers additional studies. There is an after-school programme run by the teachers to help students on a certain topic. I personally plan to attend the English impact to improve my essay style. All the teachers I have had at this school are enthusiastic about their job and enjoy passing on their knowledge to their students."

Preparation for a successful start at Heckmondwike Grammar School begins in the March before students arrive in September and continues throughout their first half-term. The process is led by the Head of Year 7 and is designed to ensure that our new students and their parents have as smooth a transition from primary school as possible.

We have set aside transition days, two of which will take place in July. These two days provide an opportunity for new students to meet with their class and form tutor, find their way around the building and enjoy some lessons. These will include Geography, Science, French or Spanish, Design Technology and Physical Education.

We welcome students with additional needs and we provide extra support during the transition phase, including further visits and one-to-one sessions with the pastoral team.

We are very proud of the level of additional assistance that we offer our students. One of our greatest strengths is the support we provide our students, both academically and pastorally.





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Extra-Curricular Activities

There are a number of opportunities for students to extend their participation during lunchtime clubs as well as after-school training sessions, fixtures and competitions. Activities on offer include concert band, soul band, guitar group, youth theatre, choir, dance club, British sign language and various modern foreign language sessions.

The physical education department enters teams into a number of competitions at local, district and county levels and students have achieved a great deal of success. The school runs teams and clubs for a range of sports, including athletics, badminton, basketball, cricket, cross country, football, hockey, netball, rounders, rugby, tennis and swimming.

Students in the school are also given the opportunity to represent their House in a variety of sports during the year; these include all of the major games as well as a swimming

gala which takes place in December, and a whole-school sports day held at the Princess Mary's Athletics Stadium in July.

The numerous musical groups together with the house drama competition and annual productions, for example, enable actors and musicians of all abilities to display their talents. Each year a large number of students succeed in the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme at Bronze, Silver and Gold; we are a licensed centre in our own right for the award and the largest provider in Kirklees.

The House System

Students are allocated to one of four houses when they join us and will remain in this house throughout their time at Heckmondwike Grammar School. House competitions in sport, music, drama, debating, chess and some curriculum-related events such as the Maths Challenge and Spelling Bee are a feature of the school and

competition is intense. Students are awarded house colours denoted by a shield badge when they participate in four house events within an academic year.

At the end of the year the Lees Cup is awarded to the most successful house when all the activities are concluded.

Parents should note that when purchasing uniform the colour highlighting on certain items needs to be in the appropriate house colour: Brontë (blue), Clarke (yellow), Houldsworth (green) and Priestley (red).

Catering

The catering provision at Heckmondwike Grammar School is provided by Mellors Catering Services Limited.

Mellors is a family run, award-winning catering company. They cater for more than 300 schools across the North of England. They aim to source produce locally and all of their food is freshly prepared on site daily. The catering team strives to support healthy lifestyles while aiming to make all dishes interesting and tasty, using a wide range of ingredients.



Together we offer a large range of hot and cold food including home-made dishes such as roasts, bakes and pies. We take inspiration from many international cuisines such as those of Italy, Spain, India and China. Our cold meal offer includes a vast range of salads and sandwiches and we also have a range of 'food to go' such as paninis, flat breads and wholesome soup.

Students may opt for the meal deal option, which includes a main meal (hot or cold) plus a dessert or tetra drink.

We feel that we offer excellent value for money and operate a cashless payment system for meals: parents are encouraged to top-up regularly using our on-line payments system, ParentPay. ParentPay account set up details will be issued to all parents. You will be able to link any existing ParentPay accounts if you choose.

Parents whose children may be eligible for free school meals (FSM) should apply to Kirklees Council. Students eligible for a FSM will be entitled to a meal deal every day, or up to the meal deal value towards other food and drink purchases.

We have recently revamped the decor in the main dining room, and plan further investment in one of the other eating areas in school. With the offer available this means that the students get the best eating experience, the best quality of food and all for the best value!

A couple of years ago the school ran a campaign to reduce plastic bottles and packaging in school. We offer drinks in tetra cartons, water bottle refilling stations and aim to recycle where possible.

Catering for up to 1,500 students and staff each day is a considerable task but one that is relished by the catering team at Heckmondwike Grammar School through Mellors.

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Entry & How to Apply

All students seeking entry into Year 7 must sit the school's entrance examination, which takes place on **Monday 13 September 2021**

To register for the entrance exam, please complete our online registration form which is accessible via our website:

Please note that registration closes at midday on **Monday 28 June 2021** and that we are unable to accept late submissions.

In order to be eligible for a place parents must also make the school one of their choices via the local authority common application system. Parents who reside outside of the boundaries of Kirklees should apply to their own local education authority.

The school offers 180 places via the local authority. All applicants will be notified as to whether or not they have achieved the required standard prior to the deadline for submission of the Common Application form to the local authority.
