Tests take place on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> November and Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> November, starting at 9am. External Candidates must sign in at reception by 8:30am and you will be escorted to the exam room from there. Internal candidates will be informed of their room in advance, please be there for 8:40am to ensure a prompt start.

- Show your student ID badge (or valid Passport / Driving Licence for external candidates)
- Hoodies, outside coats, or those that could be deemed such, are not to be worn in the exam room.
- Ensure you have the correct equipment for your exam in a clear pencil case.
- Leave personal possessions, including mobile phones, watches and smart watches, in your locker or at home. (There is no secure storage for personal items during the exam).
- You may bring water into the exam room in a clear bottle (label removed) with a sports cap.
- All candidates must wear a mask at all times on school property, unless sat in an exam when it should be kept in a clear plastic, sealed bag under your seat.
- Use the hand sanitiser on the corridor outside the exam room prior to entry.

**Finishing the test early**

Candidates who finish their test early must quietly remain in their seats until the full test time has passed. Candidates are only allowed to permanently leave the room before their test ends if there is an emergency.

**Calculators**

Candidates are **only allowed** to use calculators for the Physics Aptitude Test (PAT). **For PAT calculator guidelines, please visit:**

**Additional information for external candidates:**

- HGS has no secure storage so unauthorised items should not be brought into the building.
- HGS will not be providing equipment during the exam so ensure that you have spare pens, pencils and any other items required for your exam and that your calculator is in full working order (if required)
- Candidates will be met in reception and escorted to the exam room – please maintain distance from other candidates, students and staff when moving around the school building.
- Use the hand sanitiser on the corridor in reception on entry to the school building.
- If you have been in close contact with anyone who has tested positive for Covid-19 please inform the exams team.
