Subject Focus - Design Technology

Project Focus A level Product Design Y12

The brief: Design and make a prototype of a sustainable light that will raise consumer awareness of global environmental issues.

- Product Design A level students from Year 12 have created lighting solutions for retail giant IKEA with sustainability as the key focus.
- The brief for students was to design and create a shop-ready product in line with the values and ethos of the company.
- Students have used low voltage LEDs to illuminate their products to help maximise the sustainability of their design ideas.
- As part of the project, each of the designs produced have a focus on raising consumer awareness of global environmental issues such as deforestation, global warming and rising sea levels.
- Our students have impressed us with their innovative and creative thinking which has led to the production of some very high quality final outcomes.

Kerim enjoyed building his craft technical skills using the wood lathe to turn the main structural stand for the lamp. His main inspiration was the environment, so using timbers was a natural starting point. The timbers did not just make the product look sustainable and eco-friendly, but made the lamp look aesthetically great once assembled and finished with a light coat of Danish oil.



Design Iteration and product development

Benjamin created a lamp for the project based upon Atlas – the Greek titan who has the world upon his shoulders – with the light inside of the globe.

Initially, the structure was going to be cast using a foam mould (pictured top row), however it was a struggle to be able to carve it into the correct shape, so the methodology was changed to attempt to create the figure in a different form.



Benjamin then focused on trying to create the lamp from wood, but this also didn't work as an ornate structure was been made in a flat plane

Finally, the project was completed in acrylic in a more abstract form, leaving the final design (pictured bottom right).









Subject Focus - Design Technology continued

The Key stage 3 journey

Year 8 homes will soon be filled with beautiful scents as students design and make premium home aroma products in Design Technology as part of their exploration into Graphic Design.

Students start their product design journey as soon as they arrive at Heckmondwike Grammar School in Year 7. There is a curriculum map plotting student learning,

the reasons why and showing the stepping stone and milestone assessments that they will take along the way.






Year 7 Graphic Design begins with sketching and students will develop a knowledge of the key principles that govern several 2D and 3D sketching techniques. This knowledge can be used to self-assess students own progress as they build upon the muscle memory of sketching skills through rehearsal and practice.




Students learn how to employ several techniques with efficacy (such as rotating the page to use the body's natural articulation when sketching lines, rehearsing lines before committing them to paper; warming up before drawing; etc.) to become better at sketching.

Once all the class has mastered hand drawing and sketching they move onto 3D computer aided design providing an opportunity to design using Solidworks CAD software. Students will become equipped with the knowledge and skills needed to construct their own CAD models by using a range of core modelling tools. The CAD project will help to develop spatial awareness and the ability to design 3D products which may then be 3D printed in school.

Resistant materials study in Year 7 aims to broaden student understanding of different timbers and their classifications learning how to identify and use a variety of manufacturing techniques, tools and processes that will enable them to design and make a product using timber, mild steel and acrylic polymer. The result is the Bird House to skewer an apple to attract small birds to the garden including Blue Tits, Robins and Martins



Year 8 gives learners six blocks of focused design and make projects starting with the Magazine project in Graphics where they learn that groups of typefaces can convey different meaning through form and that designers carefully select typefaces to attract specific audiences. Learning that magazine covers comprise of a range of carefully arranged elements that are designed to aesthetically enhance their appearance to persuade consumers to make a purchase.



Professional industry-standard software comes next the class is shown how to construct a grid system using Adobe Photoshop as a guide for arranging the elements of a magazine cover to provide visual order and hierarchy.

For those progressing to GCSE Product Design this supports them with an understanding of scales of production and printing techniques provides a foundation for in-depth graphics knowledge at GCSE level.

The Air Freshener project means that students will have a basic understanding of how scent can conjure different moods and emotions. Students will have an idea of the shape and form of car air-

fresheners. New knowledge is about using empathy to understand the



needs of primary users and stakeholders will prepare students for KS4 based projects – particularly Design Ventura.

Rotating to resistant materials Design Technology students design and make a pinball game form manmade boards giving students the opportunity to use their sketching skills from Year 7 to produce a range of different design ideas for their obstacles This project has been designed

to enable students to build upon their prior workshop experience as most students will have previously used; a tenon saw, a hand file, abrasive paper, a Hegner scroll saw, a Band facer, a Pillar



Drill, a metalwork bender, a buffer and polishing machine.

Next is the Target Toy design and make project which increases student awareness of user needs, type of motion, levers and forces. How to test, analyse and modify designs in response

to customer feedback to improve the product.





That completes the Design journey for students in Key stage 3 preparing them for GCSE progression for those opting for Design Technology Graphics or Resistant Materials.



Once again parents, students and staff at Heckmondwike Grammar school have shown how generous and altruistic they are.

Not too many designers get to feature in the Design Museum - especially when they're just 14.

But a group of pupils from Heckmondwike Grammar School in West Yorkshire have just done that, thanks to their award-winning design.

They came up with Grow Wild, which allows people to easily distribute wildflower seeds from a small, simple and sustainable canon, which turn into flowers that create a source of pollen for bees.

Year 10 students Alice, Emily, Hannah and Naomi won the Design Ventura competition, a flagship Design and Enterprise project for schools, run by the Design Museum in partnership with Deutsche Bank.

The challenge was to make a product to improve everyday life which is also ethical and that can retail for around £10.

They worked with designers to turn their idea into a real-life product - and it's now on sale online.

All profits will be donated to Kirkwood Hospice, chosen by the pupils themselves because of their close connections with the charity.
