
















After completing the seven-step process, schools can then apply for Eco-Schools Green Flag accreditation, which recognises, rewards, and celebrates the environmental achievements of young people.

Boys' Friday congregational prayers



On completion they will be eligible for a lower offer, of up to a three A level grade drop or equivalent, to study at Lancaster University.




Solicitor Apprenticeship Opportunity

The Farrer & Co Solicitor Apprenticeship is a 6 year level 7 programme. Students will gain an LLB (Hons) in Legal Practice and at the end of the programme will qualify as a solicitor. All tuition fees will be paid and students will earn a salary whilst training and gaining their qualification.

Students will combine on-the-job training with guided, independent study and skills coaching delivered by the University of Law (ULaw). Four days a week will be spent working in one of our teams and one day will be allocated to study. 




