Reach your potential with NHS Cadets and learn the skills you need to support vital healthcare teams across the country.

NHS Cadets is a new scheme created by St John Ambulance in partnership with the NHS, providing opportunities to explore skills, knowledge, and volunteering roles within healthcare. It is aimed at young people aged 14 to 18 who are from communities currently under-represented within the NHS and St John Ambulance.

The programme offers young people health awareness sessions, courses to develop their leadership and communication skills and an insight or experience in volunteering within the NHS.

It is a free programme, consisting of weekly, 2-hour sessions for 11 months. Cadets will be supported throughout their volunteering journey by our NHS Cadets Team.

Who can get involved?

The initiative is seeking young people who might not have previously considered volunteering in healthcare. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Young people living with learning difficulties and / or disabilities (we will need to discuss if we have the support network to help you participate)
- Young people in the care system, or recent care leavers
- Refugees or Asylum Seekers
- Young Carers
- Homeless young people
- Those not in education, employment or training, or those with school results lower than you hoped/need
- Those living with mental health concerns (same principle as anyone with a learning difficulty or disability)
- Those who identify as being part of the LGBTQI+ community (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer intersex+)
- Those coming from low-income families /young people in receipt of free school meals
- Young people from ethnic minority communities

How do I get involved?

New groups will be opening from January 2022, and by 2023 10,000 young people will have enrolled as NHS Cadets.

(Some of) the shortlisted class of 2021-22 offer their post-interview advice:

Practice explaining things out loud and speaking clearly. More specifically for computer science applicants, read the book algorithmic puzzles it is immensely helpful to get used to the style of problems you could get asked.

Re-read everything you've submit to the university and practice different sorts of questions, preferably with someone else. The more practice, the less nervous you'll be on the day of the interview.

Expect the unexpected. When asked a deliberately awkward question, take your time to answer and explain your thought process to the interviewers clearly

Practice getting stuck on a problem and having to work your way to the solution without just looking at the answer.

Be prepared to justify and elaborate on every claim you make...try to enjoy it!

Do mock interviews, know your personal statement, research about the course at Cambridge






