

School should be informed as soon as possible and at least a week before the absence where possible.


This also applies for work experience and interviews.

I WENT TO HGS AND NOW I AM...

I graduated from Oxford University in 2018 after attending HGS between 2008 and 2015. I launched an Ed-tech startup from my student bedroom with the last £200 of my student loan. Have since scaled the organisation to £500k of funding, with commercial partners such as HSBC, Facebook, and U.K. Government. I now employ a full-time team out of an office in Central London, and have thousands of volunteers working for us across all four corners of the U.K. We have mentored over 250 low-income students into Oxbridge and 1000+ into Russell Group universities, and our social media campaigns have reached 400,000 students.









Girls into Electronics Event

Our Girls into Electronics event will provide a unique opportunity for female students in years 11-13 to find out more about studying electronics at university and hear from female graduate engineers working in the electronics sector. 

About the Summer School


This 4-day intensive summer school is designed to give attendees an insight into careers in nuclear and radiochemistry fields. Highlights include:

A-CINCH is an EU wide project which aims to increase the number of students and trainees in the field of nuclear and radiochemistry by developing a wide mix of e-learning and in-person teaching tools and courses, including a highly innovative Virtual Laboratory and lab robotics.



The summer school is intended for:

16-18 year olds from across the EU and the UK with an interest in science and in learning about the diverse careers available in nuclear and radiochemistry. A basic of knowledge of English is required for all students.
