

Cambridge Assessment Admissions Testing - October & November 2022

Tests take place on 18 & 19 October and 2 November 2022 starting at 9am. External Candidates must sign in at reception by 8:30am and you will be escorted to the exam room from there, please be prepared to show photo ID on arrival. Internal candidates will be informed of their room in advance, please be there for 8:40am to ensure a prompt start.

If you require your registration number you can find it on the bottom of the form sent to confirm your registration and for you to check your details.

The Notice to Candidates from the Cambridge Assessment Admissions Testing will be published upon publication for October and November testing.

- You may bring water into the exam room in a clear bottle (label removed) with a sports cap.

Finishing the test early

Candidates who finish their test early must quietly remain in their seats until the full test time has passed. Candidates are only allowed to permanently leave the room before their test ends if there is an emergency.
