Dear Parents/Carers

As we approach the end of term and indeed the end of this academic year, it is always my pleasure to update you on what we have been doing and some of our plans for next year. As I sit at my desk now, it seems like only yesterday I was writing a similar letter, this time last year – how the year has flown.

As we are all aware, the year has not been an easy one for any of us and the pandemic, certainly at various times, has taken a toll on us all. However, whatever troubles it has thrown at us, our pragmatic approach has always allowed us to successfully navigate the sometimes choppy waters and I am delighted to report that we finish for the summer break with the school in a very strong position.

Charity and Fundraising

Despite for many families, this year posing quite financially challenging, as a community we have raised £18,492 which is a quite phenomenal amount and way surpasses our target. Some of the charities have been the well known, national/international ones, but some of the others have been our local ones and ones which in many cases are very close to heart for some of our school community. In addition to fundraising, there have been many other worthy initiatives, not least our Eco-committee doing sterling work, making the school more eco-friendly, with litter picks, clothing exchanges and guest speakers raising awareness.

School Uniform

We are very aware, the cost of school uniform, including PE kit can be quite significant and as such, we are pleased the government is asking schools to review requirements and provision. We are fully compliant with new legislation and have reduced the number of compulsory items and increased the number of suppliers to 3, to foster more competition. Indeed, the last few days has exemplified these values, with a wonderful Sports Day, in relatively cool conditions last Friday and the incomparable 2 day House Music competition earlier this week, with a record number of entries, which is the final event of the annual House Competition. The Lees Cup will be presented to the winning House on Friday during the full school assembly. We now have over 70 clubs/societies and the challenge is always there to students to add to the list, by starting a new club, with funding available if required.

With excellent appointments already made to fill these positions, we will start September with an outstanding staff team, all graduates in their specialist subjects. As we close for the year, I would like to publicly thank all of the school staff. Every one of them plays an invaluable part in ensuring that we always provide the best possible education for our students, very often going above and beyond what could reasonably be expected of them, all because they care passionately about every individual student.

However, the real stars of the show have again been our fabulous students – your children. Despite at times another disrupted year, they continue to juggle the rigours of a very academic curriculum, and immerse themselves in the House system, all the while conducting themselves with great respect for one another, acting with responsibility and so maintain the standards that we aspire to at Heckmondwike Grammar school.

None of the above would happen without the unfaltering support from parents. Despite the very significant difficulties many of you have faced this year, you have worked tirelessly with us and I thank you for the family commitment, which is always very evident and invaluable.
