BEYOND A LEVEL

We live at a time when information is cheaper and more plentiful than at any other point in history, and as A level students you have more time outside of timetabled lessons to nurture and pursue your interests. The purpose of this guide is to help you harness these opportunities to maximise your potential, to make best use of the time and resources at your disposal, and immerse yourself in the subjects you have chosen to study.

The resources and activities that follow have been specially recommended by your teachers as excellent ways of exploring their subjects. After an initial selection of general resources that are recommended for all students, you will find pages dedicated to each A-level subject. These resources rarely refer directly to taught syllabuses and are not intended as support or revision exercises, though engaging with them is highly likely to help you improve at A level. Instead, they are intended to challenge you to go beyond the confines of exam specifications and pursue your academic interests on a deeper and broader level, hence the title of this guide.

Different types of activities have been carefully selected to suit every student, and you are encouraged to pursue your learning through a range of media. If you like to read, that's great, but why not listen to a podcast too, or enter a competition, or take an online course? Learning in new ways can be just as challenging and stimulating as learning new things. A key to different types of activity are flagged up at the bottom of each page, while a link to the Twitter page of those many departments that currently maintain one is included at the top right.

Most resources are completely free to access, usually in school or online. It is extraordinary to reflect on the volume and quality of books, lectures, research, courses, museums, galleries, creative tools, archives, music and news that can be accessed through palm-sized computers that almost everyone carries in their pocket. That sentence would have read like science fiction when you started primary school just a few years ago. You should challenge yourself to make the most of this unprecedented access to knowledge.

It is hoped that you find intrinsic value in going 'beyond A level', that independently pursuing your academic interests is an exciting and fulfilling end in itself. However, universities, employers, art schools and conservatoires are increasingly interested what they term 'super-curricular' activities, or how applicants have pursued academic interests or developed relevant skills and experience outside of their formal lessons. Your applications for jobs, apprenticeships and degree courses will be greatly enhanced by meaningful reflection on how you have engaged with activities and resources like these.

Our suggested resources and activities, at just fifteen per subject, are far from exhaustive, and it is hoped that each resource may lead you to a number of others. If you do find a particularly useful resource not included in this guide, or find that some resources we have included have grown out of date, do let your subject teachers or the Sixth Form Team know so that we can improve it for future years.
