

Realising Opportunities (RO) aims to increase access of underrepresented groups of young people to leading universities

It can help you receive lower grade offers to universities. Students who would like to apply for a place on the RO programme need to:

- Check the full eligibility criteria on the RO website. You can check if your postcode is eligible by visiting the RO website
- Use the student key **HGJERVISM01**
- Go to realising opportunities.co.uk/apply to enter the Student Application Key and complete the application form. Ask your parent/carer to complete the online parent/carer permissions form which will be sent to their email
- address once you have submitted your application.
- DEADLINE for applications 21st October 2022

Students will receive confirmation of whether they have been successful in gaining a place on RO by 6 January 2023.



About Reach for Excellence

Since its inception in 2007, RfE has built a successful track record in supporting and stretching students who have the potential to gain a place at a research intensive university, but who may not have considered it (or who may perceive barriers to entry). We recruit participants in Year 12 and provide wide-ranging support alongside their studies in Year 12 and Year 13, which will help to strengthen their attainment and prepare them for making decisions about university, whether they wish to apply to the **University of Leeds** or elsewhere.

Successful RfE applicants are invited to engage with a varied programme of subject-specific academic tasters, personal development workshops, and intensive research and study skills sessions. We also offer a variety of enrichment experiences, and our broad range of advice and guidance sessions will leave students feeling more confident when navigating their university choices and UCAS applications, and more informed about student finance and their postgraduate career options. Events primarily take place at the University of Leeds campus during school/college holiday periods, in order to minimise curricular disruption while encouraging independent study habits. RfE students will also be invited to apply for our residential summer school held at the University of Leeds in August 2023. Year 13 Application – once the application is complete

You need to check your form (common errors are)

- **1.Area of permanent residence** and **student support details** are both the council authority in which you live (home address) For most students, the **Residential category** will be 'UK Citizen – England'. A small number, without a UK passport, will be 'Settled in the UK'
- 2. The answer to 'What will be your main source of funding for your studies?' will almost always be 'UK, ChI, IoM, or EU student financial services'.
- 3.A ULN (your form tutor has this number)
- 4.For exam dates, the season will suffice. Most students will put the date they sat them (06 -June) or date of their results (08- August); either is fine, so long as they are consistent. 5. Students should remember to include the **EPQ** as a separate qualification. 6. Make sure that the **correct school** is listed for GCSEs, if not HGS. 7.All A-levels should be added with exam dates in summer 2023 and the result as 'pending'. 8. Have you included Core Maths or AS Further Maths? 9. It is your responsibility for inputting your own GCSE and other Level 2 qualifications correctly.

University access schemes





Context

 Many universities run access schemes, where students from backgrounds which make them statistically less likely to attend university are given support, which can include reduced offers.

 The main schemes used by HGS students are Access to Leeds and Newcastle PARTNERS, though other universities also have them.

Am I eligible?

- The short answer is, 'it depends'; conditions do vary. Generally, you need to meet 1-2 or more of the following criteria:
 - Neither of your parents went to university;
 - You are from a low income household;
 - You live in a post code area with low rates of progression to university;
 - You attended an 11-16 school with below average GCSE results;
 - There are circumstances in your home or personal life that have disrupted your studies.

Check the terms for each scheme carefully. They do differ.

Access to Leeds

- To be eligible for <u>Access to</u> Leeds, you need to meet two criteria.
- Many of you will be eligible.
- The reduced Access offer is two grades below the standard offer.



Newcastle PARTNERS

- Newcastle PARTNERS has changed considerably.
- You need to meet <u>one eligibility</u> criterion.
- Most (though not all) of you will be eligible.
- The reduced 'Partners' offer is now <u>3 grades below</u> the standard offer.





York Access

- To be eligible for <u>York Access</u> <u>scheme</u>, you need to meet one of a small number of criteria.
- Many of you will be eligible.
- You may receive a reduced offer.

- Add a 'P' in the further details section on Ucas.
- <u>Apply online</u> after your Ucas form has been sent. Select Mrs Jervis from the drop-down menu.
- School Deadlines: Friday 7 October (Medicine and dentistry); Friday 13 January (other courses)

Access to Leeds

- Complete your section of the <u>application form</u> and e-mail to Mrs Jervis
- Once he has returned it, upload onto Leeds' web portal.
- School deadlines: Friday 14 October (medics and dentists), Friday 13 January (other courses)

All other programmes: All students need to let Mrs Jervis know of any requirements from the school and <u>allow at least one full school week</u> to turn around a reference/online verification.




