








The number of spaces compared to applicants




## Most universities expect you to get 3 A's




Minimum grade requirements for 2023 applicants

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# UCAT Bursary support

**UCAT bursary applications are now open for your year 13 students**. This bursary allows eligible students to sit the UCAT exam for free.

Year 13/S5 students can apply below:

To be eligible, students need to meet one of the following criteria:

- Free School Meals
- 16 to 19 Bursary (England), or EMA (Scotland, Wales or NI)
- HE Student Finance means-tested maintenance award.
- Universal Credit
- Working or Child Tax Credit
- Income Support, or Job Seeker's Allowance (JSA), or
- Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Asylum Support





During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. You will gain a unique insight into how patients interact with a variety of healthcare professionals and what it's like to work in an NHS multidisciplinary team.

Attendees will have the opportunity to interact with healthcare professionals throughout each day. This will empower students to make an informed career decision and demonstrate their commitment to healthcare in their UCAS applications.

Students will receive certificates as evidence of having participated in the work experience programme. Those that complete the full 5-month programme will also be awarded Highly Commended References.
