


and the animals come to life in our scene, with complete creative freedom, and the experience was just fantastic. All the drama teachers helped loads and of course,





On Wednesday afternoon, the English department took 96 Year 11 students to see Hull Truck



Theatre's production of 'A Christmas Carol'. As this is a set text for GCSE, this was a wonderful opportunity for our students to see the festive novella brought to life – and just in time for Christmas!

The production was magnificent. One of the more notable aspects of the play was the decision to use deaf actors in key roles – Bob Cratchit and his wife. As a result, actors used British Sign Language (BSL) throughout the play, which added to the depth in which the play (and novella) explores the idea of voiceless poverty.

As an audience, there was a real empathy felt for the struggle and strength of the poor as they fought for their family.
