### The 2nd Seasonal Event - Christmas Concert

Concert Band performing 'The Incredibles' and 'The Christmas Song', performed with a glorious flute solo from Beth Kernick (Y13). This was followed by the wonderful close harmonies and growing-in-size Senior Girls Vocal Group. They performed a festive song and a treat from the hit movie Frozen. The String Group then performed the 'Arrival of the Queen of Sheba' with solos from Beth Kernick and Divya Vijayanand (Y12). Repertoire from Senior Choir included 'Gaudete', 'Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas', 'Joy to the World' and 'One Star'. The voices of the choir are really developing, and it is great to see new members in Y10





join. Junior Choir then took to the stage with beaming faces. Accompanied by Eleanor Lilley (y13) and

additional drums by Alice Kernick (Y11), they performed 'Never Enough' from The Greatest Showman, 'Underneath the Tree' and 'When a Child is Born'. It is great to see so many students involved and enjoy singing and performing together. Soul Band then kicked of the second act with some funky tunes and Christmas hits. Such a tight sound and fabulous vocals from the Y13 girls. The noisy but superb Percussion group followed with exciting pieces that were Christmas themed and got everyone jiggling in their seats. 


## The Careers Team at Heckmondwike Grammar

As well as providing advice and guidance to students, Mrs Ellis and Mrs Haigh are coordinating Work Experience and organising the careers related events which students participate in across the school and Sixth Form. Both Mrs Ellis and Mrs Haigh both hold the Level 7 Qualification in Career



Development and are both registered individual members of the Career Development Institute

Mrs Ellis joined Heckmondwike Grammar School as a Careers and Work-related learning adviser in March 2022 having previously worked in schools across Leeds. Through studying Sociology at Undergraduate level, Mrs Ellis became interested in Education and the barriers to positive progression that some students face. Football Academy **Kirklees** and College to speak to students from year 9, 10 and 11 about alternative education options following GCSEs. The event was chance for а students to explore alternative options for post 16 and A levels.

## Subject Focus - Music

It's been great to add a few new faces to our Soul Band this year, along with our regular established musicians. We now have both 4 Alto Saxes AND 4 tenor saxes – unheard of for a number of years! Our trumpet section has grown again and our 2 regular trombones, rhythm section and vocalists give us a solid band to build around. We added a few new songs this year ready for our successful performance at Marsden Jazz Festival, and we are now busy preparing to the Prize Giving ceremony – entertaining the audience as they arrive as well as performing during the ceremony itself.

**Junior Choir** is a fantastic activity for our year 7-9 students to get involved in. We have over 50 students who attend and there is nothing more wonderful than hearing groups of people sing together. We have been testing ourselves early on and have worked on repertoire which has 3-part harmonies. We are also super lucky to have a great set of male vocals in the choir. We have been working towards the Christmas concert season with a couple of festive songs: Underneath the Tree (Kelly Clarkson) and When a Child is Born (Johnny Matthis), alongside a lovely musical theatre piece; Never Enough from The Greatest Showman. A constant thanks to Eleanor Lilley (Y13) for accompanying the choir each week and at performances.

**Senior Choir** is open to all years 10-13 and staff, and we were delighted to welcome a new strong cohort of year 10 singers in September, including a good number of boys! Christmas music will include the lively medieval "Gaudete" and favourites such as "Silent Night" and "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas".

**Percussion Group** is open to all years and any standard- there is a place for all! We have grown in numbers this year to 16 and have continued to enjoy making music together. The group focuses on using the whole spectrum of percussion including: tuned Percussion, Djembe's, drums and smaller hand held instruments. We will be using a lot of Latin influences for Christmas this year, including Feliz Navidad and a Djembe piece comprising of different Latin styles.

It's been great to have our String Group growing again after our relaunch in September. We have grown in size from three members to over twelve and have been joined by honorary SG members Beth Kernick (yr 13, flute) and Divya Vijayananad (yr 12, clarinet) for the adventurous piece The Arrival of the Queen of Sheba. We are also joined by two year seven singers, Victoria Xenikaki and Jai Tantry for a dreamy rendition of Walking in the Air from the Snowman. Both pieces were performed at the Christmas Concert.

**Rock & Pop Group** have had a fantastic start to the new term with lots of new sign ups in Y7s. On Wednesdays we have over 20 members playing drums, bass, guitar, piano and vocals across 3 bands playing songs such as Live Forever, Boulevard of Broken Dreams, Walking the Wire and For Whom the Bell Tolls. As well as Wednesday's we have recently started a more senior Rock Band on Thursdays which we have been working on more challenging songs such as Billie Jean, What You Know and September. All bands are working hard together and looking forward to the concert next year.

**Senior Girls Vocal Group** – our senior girls' choir goes from strength to strength, now comprising about 24 singers. Most of the girls are experienced performers, singing in three or four parts, and we have continued to introduce more adventurous repertoire which they tackle with enthusiasm. Pieces for Christmas include "Let It Go" from Disney's Frozen and the beautiful "Star Candles" by Michael Head.

This term we have been busy working alongside Drama in starting auditions for our upcoming whole school production of 'The Addams Family' Musical. So far, we have had some amazing auditions, making casting a very difficult job. More information will follow in the new year as our rehearsals commence.



## Subject Focus - Music continued

In each year group assembly, we start the day with a musical performance. This can be from someone in that year group or sometimes a student from a different year group. We hear a range of vocalists and instrumentalists perform showcasing the excellence of the HGS ethos. Thank you to all those who have already performed, please do contact a member of the Music department if you would like to play in future assemblies.

We were delighted to be invited back to Marsden Jazz Festival this year. The HGS band have performed at the festival since 2000, but after cancellations and restrictions during the pandemic we were delighted to return again this year. Our Soul band performed a set of classic and modern soul hits at the Bandstand in the Park to a captive audience – and it was even fairly sunny this year!

In October we took our Y9 Music and Drama students, along with the A Level cohorts, on a trip to see the musical Joseph and the Amazing Technicoloured Dreamcoat at the Alhambra, Bradford. We were lucky enough to see an ex-student perform in the

production and she was phenomenal. The students really enjoyed seeing a live musical with some catchy songs and superb dancing.

House Dance was a successful house event last half term. It is great opportunity to showcase the skill and talent of our students. Dance as a creative art is often overlooked so it was exciting to see students perform different styles, capturing their culture, expression and technique in a wonderful showcase. Our guest judge was incredibly impressed with the performances.



It was once again on honour to provide the music for the Remembrance services this year. On November 11th Kyran Russell & Eleanor Turner performed Nimrod as part of our school service before



a group of students representing the school attended the memorial in Heckmondwike. This was followed by the community service on Heckmondwike Green on the Sunday, where a small band accompanied the hymn tunes. At each of these assemblies and services, Lily Dillon (Y9) performed the Last Post with great assurance – making a total of 9 performances in all!

A group of Y10 and a Y9 students set themselves a new challenge of arranging the accompanying music to the Youth Theatre production of The Snowman. Key pieces of music were arranged and performed,

all organised by the students. They rehearsed weekly, sourced music and scored it for the ensemble. What an incredible achievement.

### Year 10 and Year 12 Work Experience

The deadline for finding a placement is looming and the Christmas holidays is the perfect time to focus your attention on finding one.

Here are some top tips from the careers team to help you!

#### 1. All experience is good experience

Remember, you are unlikely to secure a placement in the job role you would like to do in the future so be realistic about who you are contacting. Working in any capacity will give you transferable skills and career capital you need to make job and university applications in the future.

#### 2. Use Google Maps to look for local businesses to contact

Google Maps is useful as it allows you to search for businesses surrounding a certain postcode. This will help you to find a local placement if you want this or one that is close to a town/city centre.

#### 3. Speak to family and friends

You can go to the workplace of a family member or a family friend and this is quite often the most valuable way to get your work experience placement sorted. Speak to your parents about what you are looking for, they may just know someone who you can get in touch with.

#### 4. Use the examples on the HGS SharePoint site

We have added the Work Experience launch resources to the HGS Careers Share Point site. You can access this by logging in on this link with your student email ad dress and the password you use to log into the computers at school – this includes a very lengthy list of employers in the West Yorkshire area.


