## **Subject Focus - Physical Education**

Pupils from the school have competed in a wide range of sports at a District, County, regional and national level over the past year.

Our athletes again excelled both on the track and in the Kirklees and West Yorkshire cross country events. Year 11 pupil Adam Pow and Year 8 pupil Poppy Nutman qualified to represent Kirklees in the West Yorkshire championships.

Girls football continues to thrive at the school after the inspiration events of last summer. Highlight was the Under 13s team winning the Huddersfield and Kirklees schools 6-a-side tournament. This season we have U13 and U15 teams competing in the Spen Valley cup and over 30 players attending training session every week.

Also in football, our Year 7, 10 and 11 boy's teams all reached their respective Semi-finals in the Spen Valley school cup competitions. This season, our Year 11 team made the third round of the ESFA national competition and the semi-final of the West Yorkshire schools county cup competition. Our U18 team competed in the ESFA national cup and West Yorkshire cup competitions. This season, in additional to the cup competitions, our senior team competed in the West



Yorkshire schools league with regular fixtures on a Wednesday afternoon as part of the sixth form enrichment programme. The team have had a great season so far losing only one match consolidating second place in the league.



In netball our teams have continued to progress in the district competitions with a clean sweep last season which was a fantastic achievement. The Year 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 teams won their respective Spen Valley schools tournaments. Our Under 18 team competed in their first competition held at the English institute of sport in Sheffield and this season they are playing regular fixtures on a Wednesday afternoon as part of the sixth form enrichment programme.

England Under 18 rugby Union tour of South Africa – Summer 2022.

Thomas was selected for the England Under 18 rugby Union summer tour of South Africa. This was a fantastic achievement and a very proud moment for Tom, his Family and the school.

The tour included three very demanding fixtures playing against the best Under 19 players in South Africa.

Tom was selected to start the first at number 5 in the opening fixture. This proved to be a very physical encounter with the majority of the England side being 17 years old competing against opponents a year older. England succumbed to defeat by 40-24. Despite the score line, the England team produced a good all round performance.

The second match of the tour saw England bounce back with superb victory as the tourists turned around a 20-5 half time deficit winning the match with a last gasp penalty to give England the win by 36 – 34.

The deciding test of the series was a dramatic affair with the home team winning a close encounter 44-41 despite England out scoring their hosts by seven tries to five.

The future of England rugby Union looks very bright and we will follow Toms progress with both the national squad and a potential professional career.

The deadline for finding a placement is looming and the Christmas holidays is the perfect time to focus your attention on finding one.

Here are some top tips from the careers team to help you!

#### 1. All experience is good experience

Remember, you are unlikely to secure a placement in the job role you would like to do in the future so be realistic about who you are contacting. Working in any capacity will give you transferable skills and career capital you need to make job and university applications in the future.

#### 2. Use Google Maps to look for local businesses to contact

Google Maps is useful as it allows you to search for businesses surrounding a certain postcode. This will help you to find a local placement if you want this or one that is close to a town/city centre.

#### 3. Speak to family and friends

You can go to the workplace of a family member or a family friend and this is quite often the most valuable way to get your work experience placement sorted. Speak to your parents about what you are looking for, they may just know someone who you can get in touch with.

#### 4. Use the examples on the HGS SharePoint site

The Bebras Computing Challenge introduces computational thinking to students.

It is organized in over 50 countries and designed to get students all over the world excited about computing.

Each participant answer questions that focus on computational and logical thinking.

Three of our pupils: Maleeha Patel (Y9), Hudson Kitching(Y8) and Saatchi Shah(Y8) achieved in top 10% of participants nationally and received special 'GOLD awards'. This means they automatically qualify to go on to compete in the Oxford University Computing Challenge in January 2023, alongside the other top-performing 10% of school pupils from across the UK.

**Saatchi Shah**, 8B2-NJS also Achieved a "Certificate of Distinction" and she also achieved a special "GOLD award" for scoring within the top 10% of pupils nationally of the Inters 12-14 category of the UK Bebras Challenge 2022.

## Subject Focus - Physics

At the start of this new school year, we have welcomed two new members to the Physics team. Mrs Westcott is our new technician, and she has made an impact straight away in ensuring that we have equipment ready in lessons and in full working order. Experimentation is an important aspect of Physics learning, and we are grateful for all we have done.

Ms Hume has joined us as a trainee teacher and has got involved in the department at all levels. She has delivered lessons throughout Years 9 and 10 and taught some old dogs new tricks by passing on new teaching ideas to the existing members of department. Ms Hume has also been supporting the Women in STEM group, set up by Izzy Hudson in Year 13, as a place for female scientists and engineers to get together.

We have been helping students get ready for their next steps throughout the term. Mr Drake has given up a lot of free time for students preparing for Cambridge and Oxbridge interviews. We were also lucky to have a visit from Rueben Price, who started his Mathematics course at Cambridge this autumn, to give advice and guidance.

Another step to help prepare our students has been the creation of weekly e-mails with revision topics and exam questions for Year 11 and Year 13. In addition to this, each stairwell has a reminder of the weekly revision topics and a countdown to the weeks left until the exams begin! A lot of students have commented how they are now starting to realise the reality of situation now that the countdown is under half a year.

To help support, provide information and "entertain" (?), the Physics department has created an Instagram account. It is worth a visit for revision guidance, curriculum links and the occasional view of a Physics teacher next to a important Physics location that they decided was worth a visit on a holiday.

The content studied this time has been varied. Year 13 have been looking at the Gas Laws and electric fields, while Year 12 have been stretching materials and building circuits. Year 11 have also been building circuits, before moving on to Radioactivity. Year 10 have been investigating moments and momentum, while Year 9 have been looking at waves and optical systems. Year 8 have been studying space, looking at our own Solar System and beyond.


# Subject Focus - Physics

Speaking of the Solar System, a cold December/January night is a suitable time to take a picture for the Physics Astronomical Photography Competition. The first competition was won two years ago by Summer Jones. Many students have access to telescopes or binoculars, but the most important piece of modern equipment for astronomy is the mobile phone. Many modern mobile phones have exceptional cameras and software to capture incredible images under a range of conditions, as well as allowing the tracking of stars, planets and satellites via many easily available apps. Simple attachment brackets, cheaply available on Amazon, can be used to attach phones to telescopes and binoculars to obtain clear images. 
