We were still able to get down it but for the first and probably only time we were able to stand safely in the middle of a very fast road! They worked together in their teams to make it to the finish. It was interesting to see how little water is in the reservoirs and we could even see the remains of the village that was flooded when Ladybower was created. We definitely need some rain but we were quite thankful that we hadn't had much during the last three days.

Well done to all the students involved. They are now preparing for their Qualifying expedition in two weeks' time.

Netball Match v Whitcliffe Mount - Thursday 29 September



For all of the above, please make sure you are logged in using your school username and password (The username includes the full @heckgrammar.co.uk). This is also the way they can access their e-mails which they should be checking daily as various messages from the school may be sent this way.

Students will also be given 3TB of storage on OneDrive. This means that they can store all their work on OneDrive and never worry about forgetting where it is saved.

In Computer Science, all work is done using Teams and OneNote. We encourage parents and carers to ask their children to show what they have done in lessons and how they keep their work organised. This also means that if anyone is absent for a lesson, they can get copies of the work from another student easily.

As with last year, we are excited to start up our various clubs again. The year 8 girls are entering the CyberFirst competition again hoping to follow in the footsteps of last year's regional winners, the Raspberry Pi makers club starts up next week with a lot of interesting ideas already coming in and there are several students setting up coding clubs to develop their own skills and share their interest in coding with younger students. 
