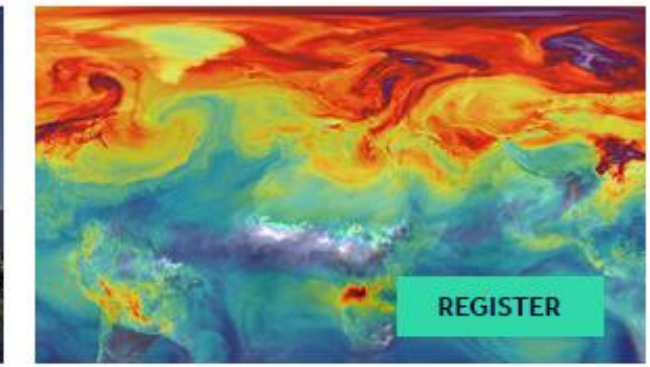

What will the apprentice be doing?

Once you have completed your first full-time semester of degree study at Sheffield Hallam University, you will move to the FDM centres (and remote working) to learn the foundations of providing IT support. Initially you will gain experience supporting the computers and IT systems of our office staff and then you will have the opportunity to go and work with one of our clients in their offices.

Your Degree Apprenticeship will continue and, after 3 years, lead to a Bachelor of Science degree.

Depending on which IT specialism you choose, you might be doing IT Support at our clients, working in other areas such as software development, protecting the company from cyber security threats, building virtual robots to repeatable jobs, analysing data, or testing systems to make sure they are ready for users.

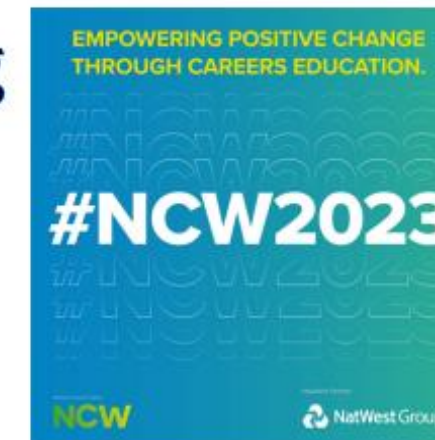
