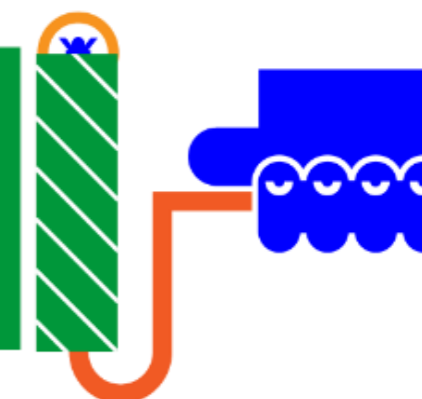

If you can spare an hour...fantastic. The day?...amazing. If it becomes a regular thing, so much the better. If we all do a bit, it will really help a lot.








Pathways to Law Enrolment

September 2023-June 2025

Pathways to Law is a free 18-month programme run by the University of Manchester and the Sutton Trust. It has been designed for under-represented year 12 and year 13 students who wish to learn about the legal field as well as what it's like to study Law at the University of Manchester. The aim of the programme is to increase social mobility for students who have traditionally been less likely to enter legal professions.

The programme involves:

- Completing relevant work experience in the legal sector (opportunities to do this with Solicitors, Barristers, and Judges across the 18-month period).
- Attending a 3-night residential at Warwick University.
- Getting assigned a university mentor to help you with university/UCAS/ applications and to answer any questions about university life.
- Visiting the Inns of Court in London.
- Meeting legal professionals and academic law students/staff to inform you about the study of Law and the different opportunities available in the legal sector.

To apply, you must:

- Be a year 11 student transitioning into sixth form.
- Attend, and have always attended, a state funded school/college
- Have achieved at least 5 GCSEs at grade 9-6, including English and Mathematics.
- Have little or no family history of university (your parents/guardian have not been to university).
- Have had free school meals and/or receive the 16-19 Bursary.

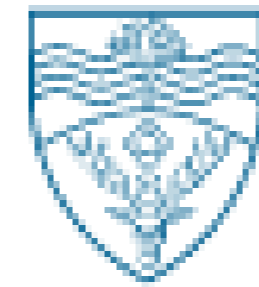
Summer Preparation Programme 2023 Lucy Cavendish, Cambridge

The Lucy Cavendish College Summer Preparation Programme 2023 is designed to bridge the gap between GCSE study to A-Levels by providing **Year 11** students with a month-long online programme of academic enrichment tailored to their stage of the curriculum.

The programme will consist of study skills workshops on a range of important themes such as time management and essay writing, university readiness sessions to support students as they plan their next steps to top Universities like Cambridge, and substantive knowledge sessions, designed to supplement students' foundational academic knowledge so that they can hit the ground running when they start their A-Levels

The Summer Preparation Programme 2023 will build on last year's programme, following which 97% of students felt more confident about starting their A-Levels

It will give you a real flavour of life at Lincoln and what to expect from studying at Oxford University. 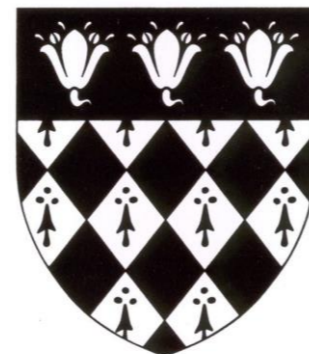

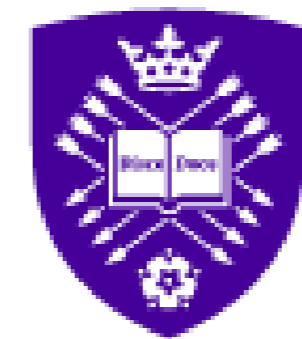

Tips for getting into Oxbridge (1)

- They want someone with a genuine interest in their subject and is a good fit for their chosen course. A student needs to show interest, aptitude and ability
- You need to be able to think critically (question the things you have learned and produce an alternative viewpoint) and learn independently
- You will be expected to study for 45 hours + per week (9 hours, 5 days a week) so getting into good study habits NOW is essential
- EPQ is a good subject to study as part of developing super curricular knowledge. Don't do it for the sake of it do it because you want to develop knowledge of your subject



Tips for getting into Oxbridge (2)

Interviews

Oxbridge interviews are not about giving the correct answers but

1. Thinking critically about information they have been given
2. Asking questions – if they don't understand something or have not studied the information being discussed they should say rather than fumbling around
3. In critically analysing the information they have been given they should formulate their own opinions and pose questions
4. Showing the genuine passion for the subject and that they have done reading beyond the classroom.
5. Consider WHY they have the views they do (Why is a common question in interviews)

These are problem solving and discussion based.



Tips for getting into Oxbridge (3)

Personal statements

Students need to show

- a genuine interest in the subject
- outside reading and knowledge beyond the curriculum (and a critical understanding rather than giving a list of reading done) (this can be gained from super curricular activities)
- what your own thoughts about the subject are
- you have studied relevant A level subjects
- Be yourself

Leeds UK undergraduate means tested scholarships

Applications for our means-tested undergraduate scholarships for UK students are now open. Students who have applied for an undergraduate degree starting in September 2023 and have a household income which meets our criteria, could be eligible for a scholarship worth £3,000 for three years.
