## Dear Parent/Carer,

I am sure you will be aware, there has been no resolution in the national dispute over pay and conditions of service between teachers and the government. There are further planned days of industrial strike action by the NEU on **Thursday 27 April and Tuesday 2 May**, which is going to cause significant disruption to our school. For these days in question, we have based our planning on the number of staff being on strike as for the previous days of action and to this extent, we feel confident we can open the school to the following students, **all other students will be asked to stay at home**.

- Years 11, 12 and 13 students should attend school as normal. We are planning to deliver normal lessons to these students, but students should ensure they have revision materials available, as in the event of one of their subject teachers being absent, they will be supervised revising.
- Parents of students in year 7 and year 8 who have insurmountable childcare difficulties will be invited to send their children to school. These students will be supervised by the cover team. This is to support parents of younger children who may not be comfortable staying at home unsupervised. - Students who are attending school will be expected to make their own arrangements for transport to and from school and check their provider is running a normal service.

The virtual year 12 parents' evening, scheduled for Thursday 27 April, will go ahead as planned.

School meals will be available for those students in school. For students working from home in receipt FSM, they will be provided with a voucher which will be sent directly to parents.

Students working from home will be expected to work on topics they are currently studying. Further advice on directing their independent study can be found below.

- Students should aim to study the subjects they would normally attend on these strike days,
  1 hour per subject.
- A reminder of what students are studying can be found in our <u>curriculum overviews</u>. This information can be used to guide them to work independently.
- For Key Stage 3 and 4 students, <u>Oak National Academy</u> provides excellent lessons in almost all subjects on a range of topics.

- All students have access to a wide range of online learning tools including <u>Educake</u>, <u>Seneca</u>, <u>Corbett Maths</u> and <u>Dr Frost Maths</u> to name but a few. Online learning tools can be used to supplement learning where relevant.
- Students should also aim to complete any homework they have been set by their teacher, details of which can be found on <u>ClassCharts</u>.
- Students who usually have 1:1 tutoring, through My Tutor or TLC Live, should continue to access their planned session.

I do thank you for your understanding in this matter and hope that some resolution can be made soon.
