#### Dear Parent/Carer

As we approach the end of term and indeed the end of this academic year, it is always my pleasure to update you on what we have been doing and some of our plans for next year. I think we are all becoming accustomed to any year not being straight forward and we have all been posed with challenges once again. Clearly the financial uncertainty is causing significant anxiety for all of us, both in our homes and our workplaces. Budgeting for the known with limited funds is always challenging, but budgeting for the unknowns has certainly resulted in a higher level of angst for all of us. However, I'm pleased to report, the school continues to be financially resilient, as a result of prudent management in recent years and we are set fair to invest in our core business of teaching and learning once again next year. At least there is now the promise of public sector pay disputes being resolved, which we recognise have been testing for all of us.

### **Extra- Curricular**

Once again, we have had an extraordinary year. I continue to marvel at how as a school community we have a wonderful balance of academic excellence, supported by exemplary pastoral care and a myriad of extra-curricular activities that students and indeed staff will long remember, which help cement our school values. We now have over 60 clubs/societies, and the challenge is always there to students to add to the list, by starting a new club, with funding available if required.

The last few weeks have exemplified these values, with the exceptional Addams Family whole school musical production last week, the wonderful Sports Day last Friday and the incomparable 2-day House Music competition this week, with a record number of entries, which is the final event of the annual House competition. As we all know, the House competition is so important to the school and the willingness of students, of differing abilities to participate, so that they get a point for their House, is humbling to see. The Lees Cup will be presented to the winning House on Friday.

# **Charity and Fundraising**

Despite the aforementioned challenges, as a community we have raised over £8500 which is a quite phenomenal amount and surpasses our target. Some of the charities have been the well-known, national/international ones, but some of the others have been our local ones and ones which in many cases are very close to heart for some of our school community. In addition to fundraising, there have been many other worthy initiatives, not least our Eco-committee doing sterling work, making the school more eco-friendly, with litter picks, and clothing and book exchanges.

We are very aware, the cost of school uniform, including PE kit can be quite significant and as such, we have worked with our 3 suppliers to reduce the cost to parents by making some items, particularly the blazer cheaper and reducing the number of branded items.
