



Medical Sciences Pathway



The NHS A Career in surgery live webinars started this week with approximately 90 year 11, 12 and 13

students taking part. The series of 3 webinars has been set up to help students gain a greater understanding of what a career in surgery entails. The webinars are being facilitated by clinical theatre teams from local NHS trusts and students have the opportunity to meet and interact with some members of the wider surgical team. Staff members will be available to answer questions and provide detailed information about the different roles and opportunities within surgery, not just the most well known such as Doctors and Nurses.

In the first session, students were introduced to the NHS and the patients journey through surgery as well as gaining a short insight into three specialist areas of surgery - Neurological, Orthopaedics and Robotics. One of the speakers showed students the equipment that would be used for a knee replacement surgery and how each of the components worked. Students were then tasked with finding out information on 3 different careers in surgery and making notes ahead of the next session which will cover the different opportunities they could consider.





