'After attending a talk with an Accountant, I was able to learn about the different careers within the financial sector of businesses and that there doesn't need to be one concrete occupation for you to take, which has helped me in understanding what area I would like to focus on.'

Hayden shared his insights from his career and even his top tips for being effective in sales. It was really useful to hear about his experiences and his advice for students interested in business. 'I attended a talk about sales and was inspired to find out more about sales in a business and understanding the complexity in its structure. I also learnt how traditional 'push' sales are quite


