Christmas Showcase Concert

Wednesday 6th December saw the return of our annual Christmas Music concert held in the Swan Hall. The students and staff have been very busy rehearsing and preparing for the event that is always a very special evening full of wonderful performances.

The concert opened with the Concert Band performing a selection from 'Hercules' and 'Carol of the Drum'. This was followed by the Junior Choir, accompanied on the piano by Catherine Fan (Y11). They performed the song 'When You Believe' and a very different version of 'Once in Royal David's City'. Although for some of them this was their first performance, they were confident and sang beautifully. Concert Band returned with the Latin American inspired number 'La Bamba' and in contrast the powerful film music from 'Pirates of the Caribbean'. This featured lots of soloists from throughout the band including a reflective bassoon solo from Euanson Wong (y10)

Senior Choir took to the stage to perform 'The Very Best Time of Year' and a traditional choral a cappella arrangement of 'Ding Dong Merrily on High' that certainly got us all into the festive spirit. The Soul Band ended the second half with four fantastic high energy pieces. The Bruno Mars song 'Run Away Baby', a very funky version of 'Feliz Navidad', the soul classic 'Spooky' and the fun song 'Mambo Italiano'. The Soul Band has been joined by two new singers this year Blossom Palmer (Y10) and Caitlan Tolan (y11). Caitlin's voice suited the soulful style of Spooky perfectly whilst Blossom tackled the fast-paced lyrics for Mambo Italiano with such confidence and flare.

The lively sounds from our Percussion Group started the second half of the concert, they

performed 'Rocking Around the Christmas Tree' and 'We Need a Little Christmas'. They certainly put a smile on everyone's faces with the added dance moves! This was followed by the wonderful voices of the Senior Girl's Choir performing Christmas Lullaby, Personant Hodie and the very complex piece 'This Little Babe' from Benjamin Britten's Ceremony of Carols. They were joined by the rest of Senior Choir for a performance of a 4 part version of the famous song 'Walking in the Air' which certainly got us all in the Christmassy mood. Next, we had a great performance from String Group, performing Praeludium and a jazzy version of 'Whilst Shepherds Watched'.

The Concert Band performed the final pieces of the night; 'Under the Sea' from the Little Mermaid and 'Troika: Midnight Sleigh Ride' by Prokofiev. For an encore, the band were joined by both Junior and Senior Choirs for a special arrangement of 'Somewhere In My Memory' from the film Home Alone. A lovely way to finish a fantastic evening of music featuring well over 100 musicians!

Star Linguists




