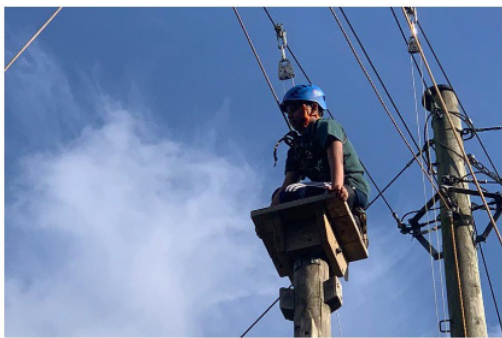
MR STEVENS AT THE HALF WAY POINT IN ACCRINGTON

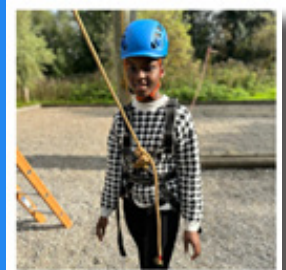


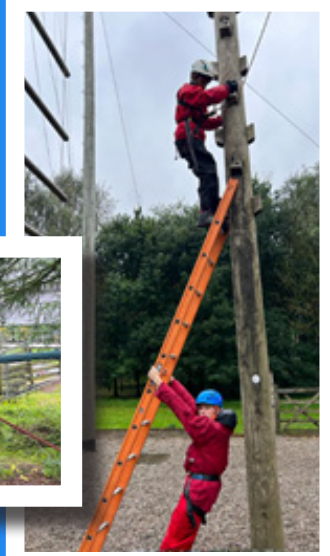
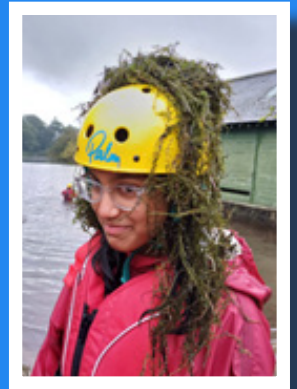




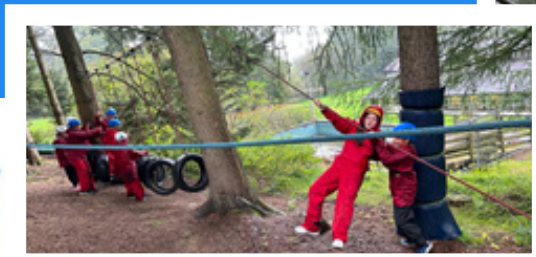
