2023 A Level Examination Results

- 79% of our recent A Level grades were A*- C
 (71% of these grades were either A* B)
- 220 A* and A Grades altogether
- 40 students achieved 3 or more grade A* or A
- 7 Students progressed to Oxbridge Universities = 3% of our cohort (National average from post-16 providers = 1.5%)


A* percentage for 2019, 2022 and 2023 Results



The UCAS process at HGS

Stage 1: research course choices and prepare applications.

Stage 2: work with form tutor in finalising applications. Predicted grades are finalised and the reference is written.

Stage 3: the application undergoes a final check and is sent to UCAS in advance of the deadline.





Predicted grades

 UCAS require schools to provide predicted grades for all students' pending qualifications. This is evidence based not based on future potential

The starting point is the last data collection point and add one grade

- Early entry students will use DC3 Year 12 data collection
- All other candidates will use DC1 year 13

If the student underperforms compared to target grades in the last data collection point, we look at earlier data collection points to see if the grade can be increased by calculating the average, then add one grade
