

### **STEMSMART 2024 Applications now open!**

**Deadline: 31st October** 

STEM SMART is a free, 17-month programme to support students in raising their attainment at school and develop their confidence to apply to study physical or biological sciences, engineering or computer science at top universities.

Each week students will be set some work that will complement the work that they are doing as part of their school studies. A large group online tutorial in each subject will be provided in each week to go over the work. Students will also be assigned a Cambridge student as a mentor, whom they will meet online once a fortnight to discuss a number of themes concerning studying at university, for example; university life, choosing courses and applying to university. Two live subject-focussed talks will also be given by researchers from the university about their cutting-edge work.

Eligible students in England, Wales and Northern Ireland will normally satisfy ALL of the following academic criteria:

- Have achieved at least a grade 7 (A) in GCSE Maths
- Have achieved either at least grades 66 (BB) in double Science GCSE or grade 6 (B) in two separate sciences from Physics, Chemistry and Biology.
- Currently be studying or have studied Maths and at least one further subject from Physics, Chemistry, Biology,
   Computer Science and Further Maths at A Level or equivalent (eg IB Higher Level).

## Access to Sheffield (university)

### Access to Sheffield (Y12-13)

The <u>Access to Sheffield (Y12-13) programme</u> offers a skills based curriculum that delivers subject and career specific support through in person visits to the University.

There are 5 different subject and career areas, therefore students can apply based on their interest and qualifications. Students will be required to live within a reasonable commuting distance of the university and travel independently to campus via public transport to attend events throughout their two years on the programme. Most events take place during term time and students will be expected to attend for the full day of activity (usually starting around 9am). There are around 4-5 events across a year, with a summer school at the end of Y12.

Students who complete the programme can benefit from up to a 2 grade adjusted offer at the University of Sheffield and benefit from transitional support in the lead up to university study.





#### Eligibility

To be eligible for Reach for Excellence, you must:

- ✓ Be a current Year 12 student.
- Have gained 5 or more GCSEs at grades 9-4, including Mathematics and English Language.
- Have the potential to achieve at least 3 A Levels at grade B or above (or equivalent qualifications), and to progress to further study at a research-intensive university.
- Live within a reasonable distance to the University of Leeds and be able to attend regular events on campus during the school holidays.

You will also need to meet at least two of the following criteria to be eligible for the scheme:

- Be in the first generation of your immediate family to apply to Higher Education.
- Be from a household with a gross annual income of £25,000 or below.\*
- Attend, or have attended, a school which achieved below the national average Attainment 8 score at GCSE.
- Live in a geographical area with low levels of progression onto higher education.
- Currently live in or grew up in public care.
- Have had your studies disrupted or adversely affected by circumstances in your personal, social or domestic life.

#### \* You can demonstrate this criteria in one of three ways:

- If you receive the 16-19 Bursary Fund, or Learner Support, with an income threshold of £25,000 or below
- If you received free school meals during your GCSE studies
- If your parent or carer completes and submits a Declaration of Household Income Form, which can be found on our website.

Pathways to Medicine is completely free (including travel) and provides support in accessing higher education, training in soft skills, and understanding careers in Medicine with incredible work experience opportunities.



## Next Step York – get lower grade offers

### What is Next Step York?

Next Step York is a personalised two year programme for Year 12 students in England.

- Explore university options
- Receive specialist support with your current studies
- Experience what life is like at York

Next Step York is aimed at pupils who have the potential to progress to university but have experienced barriers that may prevent them from accessing higher education.

We welcome applications from students living in the region who meet the programme criteria and believe they will benefit from our support.

Next Step York is open for students to apply to participate in. This programme offers everything from resilience support, academic workshops, study skill sessions and potentially a residential. Many of your students have taken part in this programme over the years, including one who studies Medicine at York and credits the programme for getting them there.

If students complete the programme and apply to York they could be eligible for an alternative offer of up to three grades below the typical offer. For example, Law could go from AAA to BBB.

Applications open on 11 September and close on 27 November.



## Realising Opportunities

Realising Opportunities is a unique collaboration of leading, research intensive universities, working together to promote fair access and social mobility of students from groups underrepresented in higher education.

### **RO** students completing the programme benefit from:

- Alternative offers from the RO Partner universities which are typically two grades lower than the standard offer when applying at university
- Experiences and support to help make informed decisions about higher education and research intensive universities
- Skills development in planning, analysis, critical thinking, evaluation and independent research
- Online support from university students and staff at the RO Partner universities
- A wide range of events and activities at the RO Partner universities. Travel costs may be supported
- Additional consideration when applying to RO Partner universities through UCAS.





## Realising Opportunities

In order to be eligible to apply for the Realising Opportunities programme students must meet all of the following criteria:

- Attend a state-funded school/college which is currently working with an RO university to deliver the RO programme. Read information for home-schooled students.
- Are studying in **Year 12** in England (or equivalent).
- Have achieved at least five grade 9–6 at GCSE (or equivalent, eg GNVQ, BTEC certificate); if this does not include English Language and Mathematics they must have achieved at least a grade 4 in these subjects. Read information for students who have experienced a period of disrupted education.
- Be a **Home registered student** or expect to be by the time they apply for higher education. Read information for students classed as an asylum seeker or with a temporary status.














## Enter a competition to win a scholarship

William Akroyd Foundation essay-writing competition, open to all sixth-formers attending schools or colleges situated within the area constituted by the former three ridings of Yorkshire. This is an opportunity to win a prize which will make a significant but limited contribution to university costs for successful candidates.

Candidates entering the competition for an open scholarship must be under the age of 25 and must have attended a secondary school for not less than two years.

Awards to successful candidates are normally available for the duration of an undergraduate programme of study; they represent a limited but significant contribution to the annual costs incurred. Awards will normally be tenable by successful candidates who intend to begin courses at a university or college in autumn 2024.

The competition takes the form of a general essay paper lasting two hours and containing twelve questions on topics of current significance. Questions are not based on any educational syllabus. They are designed rather to provide pupils with an opportunity to display their awareness of issues in the public domain, their capacity for independent thought about them, and their effectiveness in expressing their ideas. Candidates are required to write in response to one question. The paper is normally taken in school / college under invigilation. Both science-based and humanities-based pupils alike are encouraged to apply to and to participate in the essay competition.

This year the competition will take place in late November / early December 2023 (precise date to be confirmed). Applications, accompanied by copies of completed UCAS forms, should be submitted on the enclosed form to I.S. Moxon Esq. (Examiner) at the above address by Friday 3 November 2023 at the latest.

A short-list of candidates who have entered the competition will be invited to attend at York for interview with the governors of the William Akroyd Foundation on Friday 15 March 2024. Please stress to candidates that the interview date cannot be changed.

## Questions you might be asked in a university interview

These are hard to predict, so here are some pointers on what questions you may face in a uni interview:

- Revisit the university prospectus and course details, thinking about how you'd answer questions such as 'why this course?' and 'why this university?'.
- Re-familiarise yourself with your personal statement and be prepared to elaborate on anything you've said.
- Get someone (who hopefully knows a bit about your subject) to give you a mock interview. Having some interview practice beforehand will help to boost your confidence and expose areas you need to work on.
- Make sure you're aware of the latest issues in current affairs relevant to your subject – tutors may bring these into the discussion.
- Prepare some questions to ask tutors just make sure that they haven't already been answered in information you've been sent by the university.

## Do you live in Mirfield and applying to university?

About the charity

The Mirfield Educational Charity makes grants for educational purposes to students under the age of 25 who are resident or whose parents are resident in Mirfield.

### Dr Grason and the scholarship

Dr Grason retired from the charity in October 2016. He had been a trustee from the charity's inception in 1977 and for over twenty years served as chairman. The scholarship in his name is a new initiative intended to provide significant financial assistance to a hardworking and diligent student from a family of modest financial means who might otherwise not go on to higher education.

The successful applicant would receive £4,000 for the academic year beginning in September/October 2024 and thereafter £4,000 for second and third academic years subject to evidence of satisfactory progress.

### Who can apply?


There are four criteria.

- 1. Residence. The applicant or the applicant's parents must reside in Mirfield.
- 2. Age. The applicant must be under the age of 25 not only at the time of application but also at the end of the course.
- 3. Finance. The applicant must qualify for the 16-19 bursary.
- 4. Academically. The trustees are looking for a candidate who scores highly on the L3VA (Level 3 Value Added) analysis.

There is no set application form. However, the trustees will require the school or college to certify that criteria 1 to 3 have been met. As to criteria 4, the trustees will expect to receive as a minimum a copy of the candidate's UCAS application form, a personal statement and an academic reference. Deadline for applications 31st January 2024.



## Year 13 University access schemes



### Context

 Many universities run access schemes, where students from backgrounds which make them statistically less likely to attend university are given support, which can include reduced offers.

 The main schemes used by HGS students are Access to Leeds, York Access and Newcastle PARTNERS, though other universities also have them.

# Am I eligible?

- The short answer is, 'it depends'; conditions do vary.
   Generally, you need to meet 1-2 or more of the following criteria:
  - Neither of your parents went to university;
  - You are from a low income household;
  - You live in a post code area with low rates of progression to university;
  - You attended an 11-16 school with below average GCSE results;
  - There are circumstances in your home or personal life that have disrupted your studies.

Check the terms for each scheme carefully. They do differ.

## Access to Leeds

 To be eligible for <u>Access to</u> <u>Leeds</u>, you need to meet two criteria.

Many of you will be eligible.

 The reduced Access offer is two grades below the standard offer.



Newcastle PARTNERS

Newcastle PARTNERS has changed considerably.



You need to meet one eligibility criterion.

Most (though not all) of you will be eligible.

Applicants to Medicine & Surgery (A100) and Dentistry (A206)
Applications to PARTNERS from Medicine or Dentistry applicants have a deadline of 16 October 2023.

Applicants to all other UG courses

The UCAS and PARTNERS deadline for all other courses during the 2023/24 admissions cycle is 31 January 2024.

• Many of you will be eligible.

At Cambridge, we ask applicants to complete an additional form after they've submitted their UCAS application – we refer to this as My Cambridge Application.

Applicants for 2024 undergraduate entry will complete their My Cambridge Application via our new online platform. While the platform is new, the information we're asking students to provide is the same as it has been in previous years. A link will be sent to applicants via email after they've submitted their UCAS application.

# Year 12 and 13 opportunities from universities

#### **Student events**

Next Step York (apply autumn 2023)

This is a two year programme aimed at Year 12 students that have the potential to progress to university but have 'experienced barriers that prevent them from accessing higher education. You will have the opportunity to explore university options, receive specialist support with your current studies and experience what life is like at York.

#### YorWay to York (apply autumn 2023)

This is a two-year programme that supports post-16 students who are underrepresented in higher education, to reach their university goals. Each of the four modules will include a range of activities and you will be supported by current students studying at the university. Reduced offers may be considered upon completion.

#### The York Access Scheme (apply by January or March, dependent on course)

This scheme gives you the opportunity to inform the university of any circumstances that might have prevented you from reaching your true academic potential. Prospective undergraduate students could receive a reduced offer.

#### <u>Levelling Up</u> - Imperial College (apply by January)

This is a year-long academic and pastoral support programme for Year 12 students. For 2024 entry, a Physics and Chemistry strand will run consisting of fortnightly after-school online tutorials and one in person event at Imperial's South Kensington Campus. Levelling Up will support you with your A-level studies in preparation for university study.

#### Ambition Nottingham: 16-18 - University of Nottingham (apply by December)


