

The Curriculum

An exciting and broad-ranging curriculum is crucial in engaging the most enquiring of minds. Our curriculum provides the body of knowledge, skills and attitudes relevant to the high ability students who attend Heckmondwike Grammar School. Our students develop their capacity for applying this knowledge in future life so that they are fully prepared for the challenges in further and higher education, work and leisure.

Key Stage 3 (Years 7 & 8)

Students follow a curriculum of English, maths, biology, physics, chemistry (taught as coordinated science in Year 7), physical education, religious education, geography, history, technology, Spanish or French, drama, music, art, computer science and personal social and health education (PSHE).

Key Stage 4 (Years 9 - 11)

Midway through Year 8, students choose 4 GCSE option subjects to complement the compulsory subjects of English language and literature, mathematics, biology, chemistry and physics, core religious education, core physical education and PSHE. GCSEs are taught in all subjects over 3 years from Year 9 to Year 11.

The option subjects on offer to study to GCSE include: art and design,

business, computer science, drama, food preparation and nutrition, French, geography, design technology graphics, history, music, physical education, religious education, design technology resistant materials and Spanish.

Key Stage 5 (Years 12 - 13)

The vast majority of our students choose to continue with us post-16, accessing a wide breadth of A level options with enrichment electives & PSHE. Due to strong results, progression from here to a range of top universities and apprenticeships is the norm, and our students move on to high calibre careers in all sectors.

Outcomes

Our students arrive with us in Year 7 having done very well at their primary schools. Despite this, not only is the expected achievement very high, but progress is also outstanding. Year on year, GCSE results put Heckmondwike Grammar School in the top 5% of schools. From nearly 6000 schools across England, HGS is placed firmly in the top 200. An outstanding achievement which has resulted in us being named "Secondary School of the Year" in the North in the 2024 Sunday Times Parent Power Guide.



Transition & Student Support

Preparation for a successful start at Heckmondwike Grammar School begins in the March before students arrive in September and continues throughout their first half-term. The process is led by the Head of Year for Year 7 and is designed to ensure that our new students and their parents have as smooth a transition from primary school as possible. In addition to supporting students starting school in September, we have set aside two transition days which will take place in July.


These days provide two an opportunity for new students to meet with their class and form tutor, find their way around the building and enjoy some lessons providing a taster of the exciting subjects at HGS, including design technology, French or Spanish and science. In addition to the transition days, we also take our students on a residential visit to Kingswood in September which really helps cement friendships and relationships.

We are very proud of the level of additional assistance that we offer our students. One of our greatest strengths is the support we provide our students, both academically and pastorally. We welcome students with additional needs and we provide extra support during the transition phase, including further visits and one-to-one sessions with the pastoral team.

Personal Development

As well as priding ourselves on the excellent academic achievements of all our students at Heckmondwike Grammar School, we equally uphold the importance of personal development. From the very start of transition, we instil a notion of challenge and resilience, providing opportunities for our students to grow, both academically and personally. Furthermore, we strive to provide every student with the support and guidance to navigate through their options and build towards their aspirations, through an outstanding careers programme.

During transition, Year 7 students will be provided a Personal Development Record, allowing them to start tracking their development and contributions inside and outside the classroom, celebrating their successes in everything that they do from start to finish. We feel the mix of academic and personal success supports our students in understanding who they are, whilst reflecting on their own strengths and needs, growing into outstanding members of society.

Extra curricular

There are a huge number of opportunities for students to extend their participation during lunchtime clubs as well as after school training sessions fixtures and competitions. We are proud of our extensive extracurricular offer, providing over a hundred clubs and societies for students to join and grow. Activities on offer include concert band, youth theatre, crochet and chess, as well as academic societies such as the politics, economics and medi-skills.

Learning outside the classroom is integral to the way we deliver the curriculum at Heckmondwike Grammar School. The school runs teams and clubs for a range of sports including; athletics, badminton, basketball, cricket, cross country, football, hockey, netball, rounders, rugby, tennis, and swimming.

The numerous musical groups together with the House drama competition and annual productions enable actors and musicians of all abilities to display their talents each year.

Educational Visits

A large number of students succeed in the Duke of Edinburgh award scheme at bronze, silver and gold; we are a licenced centre in our own right for the award and the largest provider in Kirklees.



The resilience residential trip is a rewarding and important part of our transition process; not only ensuring that friendships are formed amongst the year group but that students face challenges which are at first daunting but soon overcome with support and guidance. These skills are carried into academic and social life with us at Heckmondwike Grammar School.

This is an account of their experience on the residential trip from a Year 7 student: 'As the trip was getting closer, I was feeling more and more anxious that I wouldn't be in a group with my friends and there would be no one that I knew. I was nervous that I wouldn't fit in and not be good at the activities set, but I was also excited about accomplishing new challenges along the way. When I was put into my group with no friends I was apprehensive but then I realised the whole trip was about making friends and I very quickly found a few more people in my group who were in the same situation and quickly got to know them better. I was feeling much more confident.

The first day was long but was highly enjoyable, my favourite activity of the day was gorge-walking. My team and I walked down a fast-flowing treacherous river which was filled with fun slides and taxing activities. We had some falls between us but we got back up again and kept on going. The team were in great spirits and working really well together, helping each other along the way. I really felt part of a team and was having so much fun.

The next day I took part in what I thought was the most challenging and thrilling activity, the high ropes. Again working as a team, we had to put other people before ourselves and help each other get as high as we could go. This activity made me feel a great sense of achievement as I found it quite difficult and daunting in parts. Adrenaline coursed through me and I managed to get to the end. My team was so supportive and I couldn't have done it without them.

The trip was a fantastic experience and helped me overcome some of my fears making new friends along the way.'

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Entry & How to Apply

Heckmondwike Grammar School is a selective grammar school. Each year we run an entrance exam. Details regarding the entrance exam and our selection process can be found by visiting the admissions pages on our website at:

www.heckgrammar.co.uk/ admissions Please note that registration closes at midday on Monday 24 June 2024 and that we are unable to accept late submissions.

In order to be eligible for a place parents must also make the school one of their choices via the local authority common application system. Parents who reside outside of the boundaries of Kirklees should apply to their own local education authority.

The school offers 210 places via the local authority. All applicants will be notified as to whether or not they have achieved the required standard prior to the deadline for submission of the Common Application Form to the local authority.
