Our school's house system is the heartbeat of our community, bringing together students from different year groups to compete, collaborate, and support one another in various events. There has been a record number of students participating in the wide range of events on offer. A grand total of 905 students have competed in at least one House event which is just under two thirds of the school. There are very few other schools who can also share results like this.

It is also wonderful to celebrate the students who have achieved their House badges. A total number of 275 students have competed in four or more events across the year. Some students successfully achieved their badge earlier this year but with events such as House Music and Sports Day where so many participated, there are many more to be received today. Congratulations everyone who has got the House badge this year, and for many of you for the second or third year running for your continued service.

A FEW FIGURES TO SHARE FOR EACH HOUSE ARE:

Bronte have awarded 66 House badges this year. And 62% of the House have participated in 1 or more events. A special mention to Praise Nduka-Obiora Y10 and Martha Walker Y9 who have both taken part in 10 events each.

Clarke have awarded 64 House badges this year. And 60% of the House have participated in 1 or more events. Another special mention to Ben McNally Y8 who has taken part in 10 events also.

Houldsworth have awarded 65 House badges this year. And 60% of the House have participated in 1 or more events. A special mention to Rueben Booth Y9 who has completed 11 events and an incredible mention to Tahmeed Bhuiyan in Y8 who has taken part in a staggering 12 events.

Priestley have awarded 80 House badges this year. And 62% of the House have participated in 1 or more events. A special mention to Evie Lu Y7 who has completed 10 events and to Hassan Hariri Y8 who has taken part in 11 events.
