After Every Lesson

- 1 Make sure your core notes are completed as well as any related activities.
- 2 Highlight your notes, identifying new keywords, terms and significant factors. Review your notes and add "post-its" next to anything that you don't understand so that you can search for the answer or ask about it next lesson.
- 3 Review the lesson on Teams to ensure you haven't missed anything and have a complete understanding of all the content.
- 4 Read the relevant sections in your textbook. Add anything extra or interesting to the notes acquired in class.

Weekly

- Complete all directed study tasks as required.
- Review your notes, ensuring nothing is missing and they're of the required quality
- Read articles about Religious, Studies, Philosophy and Ethics & our course – from journals, books, magazines and websites.
- Check the relevant information with the textbook / revision guide. If still stuck, make a note to check with the teacher
- Access past papers on the Eduqas website
- Access lesson powerpoints on Microsoft Team

Fortnightly

Read articles and news stories to gain a deeper understanding and keep up with current events and thinking in the subject.
Create & use revision materials such as flashcards and knowledge organisers to prepare for future examinations

Half-Termly

Access the super curricular resources such as wider reading and research.
After completing a topic, access the revision guides – go back to these to refresh your knowledge and understanding.
Do past paper questions under timed conditions and bring to your teacher for feedback or work with a small group and peer assess.
