Green Week

It is for this reason we are running Green Week during the last week of this half term: Monday 31 March – Friday 4 April.

Our Green Week will focus on raising awareness of the major environmental issues facing society, as well as provide opportunity to make a positive difference to the local environment. We aim to educate and empower students to make sustainable choices as individuals, and to spread their knowledge and passion with their families, friends and local communities, in turn helping to promote a culture of sustainability within and beyond the school.
