KS 4 Year 9 Curriculum Overview

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Term 2

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Topics being taught

Portraiture/Architecture – 2D Recording

Students will commence a yearlong exploration into 'Portraiture'.

This term they will explore how to successfully record using the Formal Elements to capture 3D detail and realism. They will also be taught how to use varied art media to experiment with visual language linked with the research of chosen artists.

What you will be assessed on

Your ability to capture the proportions and 3D detail of the person that you choose to draw.

Realism and the use of a full tonal scale form the basis of that assessment.

Your ability to look at the work of two portrait artists (of your choice) and use this study to inspire the creation of your own portraiture that shows clear visual links to your research.

How you can support at home

Encourage your child to take photographs that showcase skill not just point and click.

Encourage drawing for pleasure to develop observational skills in a range of 2D media.

Ask your child questions about what they have learnt so far about the use of tone to create realism.

Ask your child questions about what type of portraiture they like and why?

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Topics being taught

Portraiture/Architecture -Experimentation

Students will continue their yearlong

What you will be assessed on

Your ability to playfully experiment with media and techniques whilst maintaining purpose in what you do.

How you can support at home

Encourage your child to research 'other' art techniques to broaden their awareness of art practice.

Autumn Term

This term they will learn a variety of art, craft and design techniques that were too complex, or time consuming to study in year 7 & 8.

They will be taught how to experiment with media in a meaningful way; reviewing and refining as they progress.

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Topics being taught

Portraiture – Final Outcome Development

Students will culminate their yearlong exploration into 'Portraiture/Architecture'.

This term they will learn how to utilise their previous study in Topic's I and 2 and they will design and create an outcome that explores an area of interest to them. The aim is that they will showcase mastery of skill and their developing creative voice.

Your ability to review and refine your various creative experimentations to constantly improve the quality of your work and create high quality

How you can support at home
